DISCUSSION:

Clovis North High School student Surabhi Khanna was honored January 18, 2024, by Fresno County Superintendent of Schools (FCSS) Dr. Michele Copher and the FCSS Board of Trustees for her work to create campus resources around cultural proficiency and other service work she has done in the community and at her school. The Superstar award honors exemplary Fresno County students each month for giving back to their schools and community. Surabhi will be present at this March 20, 2024, Board meeting to share details of her Superstar award-winning project with members of the Governing Board.

Additionally, the FCSS annually honors the top educators in the Central Valley through its Educator of the Year program. Each school district in Fresno County nominates a distinguished classified, certificated and administrative employee to represent their district in the program. Clovis Unified's nominees for the 2023 Educator of the Year Awards were:

DISCUSSION:

SOS provides outdoor educational programs to both Clovis Unified schools and non-Clovis Unified schools. The funding for operations comes primarily from the per-student fee to attend. Educational Services continually evaluates the fiscal viability of SOS to ensure that it has little to no impact on the District's General Fund Budget.

SOS prides itself on providing a quality outdoor educational experience while making it affordable for all children. Due to increases in expenses such as multi-year salary increases, benefits, food, utilities, maintenance, and program supplies, SOS is recommending a fee increase to cover these expenses. SOS will continue to expect to operate as a self-sustaining program that is 100% funded by the fees generated.

The attached survey of similar programs demonstrates that the proposed increases are very competitive and SOS' proposed fees remain lower than other comparable programs. SOS has been cautious, and will continue to be cautious, in increasing attendance fees.

SOS is recommending a 20% increase for all CUSD and non-CUSD schools to allow for efficient operations and continue to be self-sustaining. This increase will keep SOS competitive in the outdoor education market and allow flexibility in the budget for future additional expenses that may arise. If approved, the fee increase would take effect for the 2024-25 school year.

To ensure the future sustainability of the program it is proposed that SOS would annually increase fees equal to estimated Consumer Price Index (CPI) percentages based on the following calculation:

1. Annual Adjustment: The fees for SOS programs will be adjusted annually in January based on the percentage change in the State's CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the preceding year.

2. Calculation: The fee adjustment will be calculated by multiplying the current fee amount by the percentage change in the CPI-U. The formula for calculating the adjusted fee is as follows:
Adjusted Fee = Current Fee * (1 + CPI-U Percentage Change).

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

It is projected that implementation of the recommended fee increase will generate enough revenue to cover on-going increases in operating this valuable program for students.

Figure 1 shows that Nature Bridge is at the top of the comparison market with Clovis Unified students and Clovis Unified non-students at the bottom of the market. Most if not all programs do plan to raise their fees for the 2024-25 school year.

Figure 2 represents fee increases for non-CUSD schools at 20%. For SOS to keep pace with cost increases in salaries (5.5% 2021-22, 7% 2022-23 and 5.5% 2023-24), benefits, food, utilities, maintenance, and program supplies (estimated minimum of 6% increase) yearly fee increases must occur based on the governor's January proposed budget.

Rationale for Increase in SOS Fees

The last fee increase took place during the 2022-23 school year at 18% to cover the increasing cost of minimum wage, wage increases, retirement contributions, step and column, and cost of goods/services to increase operating revenue to \$3,250,000. Since the 2021-22 school year, SOS has had to/will have to absorb the following increases to the budget:

- 2021-22 California Consumer Price Index Increase (CPI) 5.78%
- 2021 to 2024 Combined increase to PERS 29% (All but one SOS employees are in the PERS category)
- 2021-22 5.5% employee salary schedule increase
- 2022-23 CPI Increase 5.69%
- 2022-23 7% employee salary schedule increase
- 2023-24 CPI Increase 3.55%
- 2023-24 5.5% employee salary schedule increase
- 2024-25 Projected CPI Increase 3.03%
- 2025-26 Projected CPI Increase 2.64%
- 2026-27 Projected CPI Increase 2.90%
- 2024 to 2027 Potential salary schedule increases

During the 2024-25 school year, SOS will absorb all step increases for most employees as well as the increases shown above in future years. The District Business Department overseeing the SOS budget projects needing \$3,900,000 to operate in 2024-25 (this includes the recent addition of an LVN to the SOS budget). Utilizing the current fee schedule, SOS will likely project a \$650,000 deficit.

Sierra Outdoor School administration is recommending a 20% increase to cover all the additional expenses. The increase will keep SOS competitive in the outdoor education market and allow flexibility in the budget for any additional expenses that may come forward.

Additionally, Sierra Outdoor School would like to have an annual fee increase equal to the estimated CPI percentages. The calculation is as follows.

1. **Annual Adjustment:** The fees for the Sierra Outdoor School programs will be adjusted annually in January based on the percentage change in the CPI-U for the preceding year.
2. **Calculation:** The fee adjustment will be calculated by multiplying the current fee amount by the percentage change in the CPI-U. The formula for calculating the adjusted fee is as follows:
$$\text{Adjusted Fee} = \text{Current Fee} * (1 + \text{CPI-U Percentage Change})$$

California Education Code Section 39800.1(a) states, "As a condition of receiving apportionments under Section 41850.1, a local educational agency shall develop a plan describing the transportation services it will offer to its pupils, and how it will prioritize planned transportation services for pupils in transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and any of grades 1 to 6, inclusive, and pupils who are low income. The plan shall be adopted by the local educational agency's governing board on or before April 1 of each year."

**RESOLUTION TO DECLARE
CALIFORNIA ADULT EDUCATION WEEK
April 7-13, 2024**

WHEREAS, the first recorded adult education class in California was held in the basement of St. Mary's Cathedral in San Francisco in 1856. The class was authorized by the San Francisco Board of Education to teach English to Irish, Italian, and Chinese immigrants. John Swett, who was the first volunteer teacher for the class, later became a State Superintendent of Public Instruction; and

WHEREAS, adult schools have been utilized on numerous occasions to assist the state as it dealt with significant social, political, and economic issues through job training programs during World War II, immigration reform of the 1980s, and most recently, the Great Recession; and

WHEREAS, adult education in California overcame its biggest challenge as a result of the severe economic crisis facing both the state and the nation in 2008-09. Funding that was previously reserved to adult education was redistributed to other levels of education in the state, resulting in many adult schools decreasing in size with some closing; and

WHEREAS, over 66% of adult learners enrolled in adult schools across California in 2022-23 were between the ages of 25-54, making them very likely to have children in our public school system. The impact of adult education is felt across generations, particularly for early childhood learners who have been characterized as a priority of the Governor and Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Clovis Adult Education successfully serves Clovis Unified School District and the surrounding communities through its collaboration with its community college partners and community-based organizations through the Adult Education system. Clovis Adult Education served 9,145 students in the 2022-23 school year; and

WHEREAS, Clovis Adult Education provides significant and varied classes and programs to Clovis Unified School District and the surrounding communities, including classes in healthcare training, computer technologies training, job preparation classes, high school diploma and equivalency programs, English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, citizenship classes, and more; and

WHEREAS, Clovis Adult Education served students in the high school diploma and GED programs in the 2022-23 school year. The programs help minimize the high school dropout rate. Two hundred eighteen students earned their high school diploma, and 13 students earned their GED in the 2022-23 school year; and

WHEREAS, Clovis Adult Education served 764 students in the ESL Program in the 2022-23 school year, and parents enrolled in ESL classes learn how to assist their children with school work and dedicate several hours a year tutoring their own children; and

WHEREAS, Clovis Adult Education provides a safe environment for its students free from discrimination or bullying regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or socio-economic status; and

WHEREAS, amid the COVID-19 pandemic Clovis Unified School District continued to provide critical programming and services to our adult education students and their families via literacy and basic skills to help ensure our K-12 students were successful as they navigated the challenge of distance learning to finish the school year; and

WHEREAS, amid the COVID-19 pandemic and continuing today, Clovis Adult Education provides important short-term training programs, including critical healthcare positions, to address the short- and long-term impacts of COVID-19 and to respond to Governor Newsom's charge to address the needs of our communities; and

WHEREAS, the California Adult Education Program celebrates its tenth anniversary this year, having been established in law in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the State of California proclaims April 7–13, 2024, as Adult Education Week.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board of the Clovis Unified School District declares April 7–13, 2024, as Adult Education Week and recognizes the important role of adult education in addressing the needs of our communities in the short- and long-term and to increase access to programs and services for the most in-need and not-yet- reached members of our great State.
