4. Facilities (Fogg, Heryford, Sandoval)

At the May 18 meeting of the Facilities Board Subcommittee, members reviewed the change orders, bond measure finance report, and design/bid/construction reports. Members also discussed the current Cole Elementary School modernization project which has been affected by the State's slow response to issuing and selling Proposition 51 bonds for school facility projects, which the voters passed in November 2016. Clovis Unified is slated to receive \$78 million in Proposition 51 facility funding reimbursements for projects that have already been completed. Until that money is received, the District is slowing down its planned modernization projects. Facility use fees were also discussed and whether current rates are in need of adjustment. Clovis Unified's facility use fees were last adjusted in 2010. Annually, the District receives 44,000 external requests to use its facilities, which are processed by only two employees. In order to effectively cover costs, the Facilities Department may provide Subcommittee members with recommendations for potential fee increases at a future meeting.

Purpose & Mission

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID), is a college readiness system for elementary and secondary students. The AVID program is designed to increase the number of students who enroll and succeed in higher education and life beyond high school. Although AVID serves all students, the focus is on students in the academic middle. In the AVID elective class, students receive daily instruction and support to prepare them for college with academic strategies like writing to learn, inquiry, collaboration, organization skills, and critical reading. AVID trained educators teach students academic and social skills to help them develop the habits and behaviors needed to succeed in learning rigorous curriculum. The AVID College Readiness System is a catalyst for developing a school culture that closes the opportunity gaps many students face and preparing all students for success in a global society. AVID fosters not only a culture of college awareness, but also a common belief in student success, positive/safe environment and high expectations for ALL. The systemic approach is designed to support students and educators as they increase student learning and performance.

AVID Students:

- will succeed in rigorous curriculum
- will enter mainstream activities of the school
- will increase their enrollment in four-year colleges
- will become educated and responsible participants and leaders in a democratic society

District Overview

The AVID system has been in transition this year to a new certification model. The goal of the certification process is to implement AVID not just in the AVID elective class, but to move AVID Schoolwide, promoting the philosophy and vision of college/career readiness for all students. The certification process provides a systematic pathway to impact more students Schoolwide. The process is labor intensive, but the data and feedback it provides to our sites is critical to their sites contentious cycle of improvement and success. The process is structured around four Schoolwide Domains: Instruction, Systems, Leadership and Culture. Listed below is this year's focus and goals.







Title: Resolution No. 3642 – Education Protection Account

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Resolution No. 3642 regarding the annual Education Protection Account, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

Proposition 30, the Schools and Local Public Safety Protection Act of 2012, approved by the voters on November 6, 2012, temporarily increases the State sales tax rate for all taxpayers, and the personal income tax rates for upper-income taxpayers. New revenues generated from Proposition 30 are deposited into a State account called the Education Protection Account (EPA). EPA funds are based on the proportionate share of the Statewide revenue amount. A corresponding reduction is made to the Local Education Agency's revenue equal to the amount of its EPA entitlement.

The District's State revenue is now comprised of three funding sources: State aid, EPA, and property taxes. The addition of a new funding source does not increase the District's revenue funding because the State aid revenue is decreased according to the amount of EPA funds received.

At the beginning of each year, the Department of Finance estimates the amount to be transferred into the EPA for districts. EPA revenue funds for Clovis Unified will be deposited into restricted resource 1400. These funds must, therefore, be accounted for under the following reporting requirements:

- 1. Each year the Governing Board must approve a spending plan for the EPA money.
- The EPA funds cannot be used for the salaries or benefits of administrators or for administrative costs.
- 3. The District must publish on its website the amount of EPA money received and how it was spent.
- 4. An annual audit will be required to verify that EPA funds were spent in accordance with the requirements of Proposition 30. The cost of this audit can be paid using EPA funds.
- 5. The spending plan must be approved at the time the District's annual budget is adopted.

The temporary sales tax approved with the passage of Proposition 30 expired at the end of the 2016 calendar year. The personal income tax rates for upper-income taxpayers was due to expire at the end of the 2018 calendar year. On the November 2016 ballot, California voters approved Proposition 55, extending the Proposition 30 income tax increase for upper-income taxpayers through 2030.

This annual EPA resolution will be reviewed during the June 12, 2018, Budget Board

Subcommittee meeting. The resolution and proposed spending plan are attached.

RESOLUTION NO. 3642 BEFORE THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT IN THE MATTER OF EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT (EPA) FRESNO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

RESOLUTION REGARDING THE EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT (EPA)

WHEREAS, the voters approved Proposition 30 on November 6, 2012; and, WHEREAS, Proposition 30 added Article XIII, Section 36 to the California Constitution effective November 7, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund, an Education Protection Account to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36(f); and,

WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the Director of Finance shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the Education Protection Account during the next fiscal year; and,

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the Education Protection Account within ten (10) days preceding the end of the fiscal year; and,

WHEREAS, all monies in the Education Protection Account are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools, and community college districts; and,

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor, or any agency of state government; and,

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the school, or schools, within its jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the District shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the Governing Board; and,

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators, or any other administrative cost; and,

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district, and charter school shall annually publish on its internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent; and,

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution; and,

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts, and charter schools must comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36, and may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Act, and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36, and the spending determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the Governing Board of Clovis Unified School District;

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that to be in compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the Governing Board of the Clovis Unified School District has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Act as attached.

The Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) College Readiness System is dedicated to closing the achievement gap for all students by preparing them for success in secondary school, college and career. The focus is on meeting the needs of students who traditionally have been underrepresented in higher education.

Contracts with AVID provide teachers with research-based strategies and curriculum at all secondary schools for grades 7-12, as well as at Fort Washington, Jefferson, Miramonte, Pinedale, Tarpey and Weldon elementary schools.

Contracts also provide annual District leadership training, staff training and summer institute opportunities, which are considered by many to be some of the best education-related professional learning in the country. AVID's impact goes beyond the AVID elective and uses academic strategies school-wide such as writing to learn, inquiry, collaboration, organizational skills and critical reading, as trained teachers use AVID library/materials and methodologies in their specialized content areas.

The 2018-19 budget is funding this proposal. Based on the Governor's May Revise for 2018-19 the State is projecting a 3% COLA for the LCFF and full implementation of the funding formula. The gap closure and COLA will generate an additional \$25 million of "new", ongoing revenues. Categorical programs will receive a COLA of 2.70%.
2) If this is a single year agreement, how will the ongoing cost of the proposed agreement be funded in the next TWO SUBSEQUENT years? (i.e., What will allow the district to afford this contract?)
The District's General Fund reserve is projected to be 17.83% for 2017-18, as of the Third Quarter budget projection. The District reviews the current budget and five subsequent budgets (5 years) to determine our ability to afford any compensation increases. Based on this multi-year projection, that includes all future projected revenues and expenditures, the District's general reserve is not projected to drop below 13%.
3) If this is a multiyear agreement, what is the source of funding, including assumptions used, to fund these obligations in subsequent years? (Remember to include compounding effect in meeting obligations.)

Yes, this will increase the District's operating deficit. However, it should be noted, the District has a 17.83% reserve as of the Third Quarter 2017-18 fiscal year budget. The reserve percentage typically increases by 1-2% upon closing the books. Given the current financial information and multi-year projection, the District is projecting a 18.46% for 18-19, 16.42% for 19-20, and 14.09% for 20-21. These reserve percentages were calculated taking the 3% on schedule salary increase into consideration. This reserve level is well above the State required 2%.

Title: Annual Agreement with Educational Mental Health Associates

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize Clovis Unified to enter into an annual agreement with Educational Mental Health Associates to provide educationally related mental health services to eligible Special Education students as described in their Individualized Education Programs.

DISCUSSION:

In order to meet the goals of their Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), some Clovis Unified students require educationally related mental health services by licensed clinicians. To increase the efficiency and effectiveness of Clovis Unified's delivery of these services, it is recommended that the annual agreement with Educational Mental Health Associates be approved.

Educational Mental Health Associates is managed by Teri Roltgen, LMFT, as a non-public agency in order to attract qualified clinicians to provide educationally related mental health services for Special Education students.

The contract amount includes all costs associated with the provision of these services, including licensed therapists and/or clinicians. Furthermore, use of Educational Mental Health Associates meets all compliance requirements established by the State of California.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

The agreement with Educational Mental Health Associates, which is not to exceed \$642,320 for the 2018-19 school year, has been included in the 2018-19 Special Education Budget. This amount is equal to the projected educationally related mental health service needs of identified Special Education students.

Title: Authorization to Purchase Via Piggyback from National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the purchase of repairs, services, supplies and equipment utilizing National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance (National IPA) and recognize that it is in the District's best interest to make the purchases without advertising for bids pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 20118.

DISCUSSION:

National IPA awarded a piggyback bid for the purchase of parts, supplies and services. Many contracts are valid through 2023. Current and subsequent orders would only be placed against these bids as long as it remains in the best interest of the District.

Section 20118 of the California Public Contract Code provides that the Governing Board of a school district may authorize the purchase of equipment, materials, and supplies from another public corporation or agency without advertising for bids if the other public corporation or agency has complied with all Public Contract Codes regarding the purchase of similar equipment, materials and supplies.

National IPA competitively bids for many types of service and supply contacts with organizations throughout the country. The District can utilize National IPA Contract R150801 – ThyssenKrupp Elevator for State of California mandated elevator service and repair needs. The National IPA contract allows for continued service from this organization while receiving reduced pricing for up to five (5) years.

Purchasing staff reviewed and compared pricing with various available contracts. Pricing is better with the National IPA contract. Purchasing staff will continue to monitor pricing trends and available contracts to determine which contracts best meet the needs of the District.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

No fiscal impact included in the 2018-19 Maintenance Department Budget. Anticipated District pricing, if contracting directly with the vendor for State-mandated inspections, reports to the State, and routine maintenance service, is \$5,600 per month. National IPA contract pricing will be \$4,962.55 per month for the same level of services currently provided. By utilizing contract pricing under National IPA, the District will realize an annual savings of \$7,649.40. Any additional non-routine repairs will be invoiced on an as-needed basis utilizing contract R150801 pricing.

Authorize the Superintendent or designee to enter into an agreement with Municipal Asset Management for the 2018-19 computer refresh program at an interest rate of 2.945%.

DISCUSSION:

The District established the computer refresh program in the 2004-05 school year and has continued the program each year. Through this program, equipment is used by staff for three years and then placed into the student-use pool at school sites to be used for the next two years. Once the equipment is five years old or older, it will continue to be used but will not be repaired, as maintenance costs exceed the value of a computer that is more than five years old.

To fund the computer refresh program, the District has pursued a three-year lease program with an option for a \$1.00 buyout at the end of the lease period.

BULLYING

PURPOSE: To establish a policy to ensure every student shall be free from bullying at school or school-related activities.

The Board declares that it is the District's policy to prohibit discrimination, harassment, intimidation and bullying based on actual or perceived characteristics described in Penal Code section 422.55, Education Code section 220, or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. This policy applies to all acts related to school activity or school attendance occurring within a school under the jurisdiction of the District Superintendent. The Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent to establish procedures in keeping with this policy that will ensure that students are free from discrimination, harassment, intimidation and bullying.

The Board further authorizes the Superintendent to provide a mechanism for receiving and investigating complaints of discrimination, harassment, intimidation and bullying based on actual or perceived characteristics described in Penal Code section 422.55, Education Code section 220, or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. Said complaint process must:

- 1. Require all school personnel who witness an act of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying, to take immediate steps to intervene when safe to do so.
- 2. Set forth a timeline to investigate and resolve complaints of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying that shall be followed by all schools under the jurisdiction of the District.
- 3. Include an appeal process afforded to the complainant should he or she disagree with the resolution of a complaint filed pursuant to this policy.

All forms developed pursuant to the complaint process shall be translated in keeping with Education Code section 48985. All individuals making a complaint alleging discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying pursuant to this policy shall be protected from retaliation and have their identity remain confidential, as appropriate, which includes the confidentiality of immigration status.

The Board directs the Superintendent to publicize the District's bullying policy, including a description of how to file a complaint, and to ensure that the policy is posted in school offices, schools, staff lounges and student government meeting rooms.

The Board directs that students be educated regarding bullying and harassment, which shall include education of students regarding the negative impact of bullying other students based on their actual or perceived immigration status or their religious beliefs or customs. The Board further directs that staff also be trained to ensure that they are aware of their duty to take responsible steps to eliminate a hostile environment and respond to any incident of harassment based on any protected actual or perceived characteristics. Such training should, at a minimum,

provide District staff with the skills to do the following:

- Discuss the varying immigration experiences among members of the student body and school community;
- Discuss bullying-prevention strategies with students, and teach students to recognize the behavior and characteristics of bullying perpetrators and victims;
- Identify the signs of bullying or harassing behavior;
- Take immediate corrective action when bullying is observed; and
- Report incidents to the appropriate authorities, including law enforcement in instances of criminal behavior

The Board identifies the Associate Superintendent, School Leadership as the responsible District employee for ensuring compliance with this policy.

This policy shall not be construed to limit pupil rights to free speech as protected by the United State Constitution, the California Constitution, or other applicable law.

The Board has also adopted Board Policy No. 2108, regarding nondiscrimination, and Board Policy No. 2111, regarding sexual harassment.

Admissions Residency and School Attendance
STUDENT RESIDENCE AND STUDENT ENROLLMENT

PURPOSE: To define student residence for purposes of school attendance **and enrollment**

criteria.

It is the policy of the Governing Board that a student whose legal residence is within Board established attendance boundaries of a school, has an entitlement and shall attend that school, subject to the provisions outlined below. The Governing Board desires to admit all students who reside within district boundaries or who fulfill the district residency requirements through other means as allowed by law. The Superintendent or designee shall develop procedures to facilitate the receipt and verification of students' proof of residency.

The Superintendent or designee shall annually notify parents/guardians of all existing attendance options available in the district, including, but not limited to, all options for meeting residency requirements for school attendance. (Education Code <u>48980</u>)

The Superintendent or designee shall require parents/guardians to provide documentation of the student's residency upon admission to a district school. A copy of the document or written statement offered as verification of residency shall be maintained in the student's mandatory permanent record. (5 CCR 432)

When establishing a student's residency for enrollment purposes, the Superintendent or designee shall not inquire into a student's citizenship or immigration status.

A student's enrollment may be denied when the submitted documentation is insufficient to establish district residency. In any such case, the Superintendent or designee shall notify the parent/guardian in writing, including specific reasons for the denial.

Specifically, the legal residence of a child for purposes of school attendance is the residence of the parent/legal guardian absent a special circumstance, such as:

- a. Placement of the child in a licensed children's institution or foster home pursuant to actions under the Welfare and Institutions Code. An agency placing a student in such a home or institution shall provide evidence to the school that the placement or commitment is pursuant to law.
- b. An adult student or emancipated minor who has established a residence apart from the parent.
- c. A student whose parent/guardian has established the residence of the child in a licensed home or the home of a relative of the first degree.
- d. A student residing in a state hospital within the boundaries of the school district.
- e. A student whose parent/legal guardian is employed within the boundaries of the District pursuant to Section 48204(b) of the California Education Code. These students will be

placed at a school site at the discretion of the Director of Student Services and School Attendance or designee.

f. A student who is living in the District but does not have a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence pursuant to Title 42 of the United States Code, section 11434a.

Admission pursuant to the above subdivisions is subject to the procedures and regulations established by the Superintendent or designee.

School attendance areas are established by action of the Board and are on file in the District Office. The Board authorizes the Superintendent or the Director of Student Services and School Attendance to establish procedures and regulations providing for the determination of the legal residence of students and the proper school of attendance. The procedures shall include:

- 1. A specific provision that precludes inquiry regarding a student's citizenship or immigration status or the citizenship or immigration status of a student's parents or guardians.
- 2. A specific provision that ensures that staff shall not seek or require, to the exclusion of other permissible documentation or information, documentation or information that may indicate a student's immigration status, such as a green card, voter registration, a passport, or citizenship papers.
- 3. Where any law contemplates submission of national origin related information to satisfy the requirements of a special program, staff shall solicit that documentation or information separately from the school enrollment process.
- 4. Where permitted by law, the Superintendent shall enumerate alternative means to establish residency, age, or other eligibility criteria for enrollment or programs, and those alternative means shall include among them documentation or information that are available to persons regardless of immigration status, citizenship status, or national origin, and that do not reveal information related to citizenship or immigration status.
- 5. Where residency, age, and other eligibility criteria for purposes of enrollment or any program may be established by alternative documents or information permitted by law or this Board Policy, the procedures and forms shall describe to the applicant, and accommodate, all alternatives specified in law and all alternatives authorized under this policy

Enrollment Not Requiring District Residency

When approved by the Board and the appropriate agency, the District may enroll students from other countries who are in the United States on an F-1 visa or are participating in an international exchange program under the sponsorship of a government-approved agency.

PURPOSE: To express the Board's awareness that it may be necessary for law

enforcementpeace officers to contact pupils on the school campus and to

prescribe the appropriate manner for such contacts to be made.

The Board recognizes that on occasion it is necessary for probation officers, law enforcement **officers** and protective service personnel to discharge their duties on a school campus.

The Board notes that the California Education code requires school officials to impress pupils with the elements of good citizenship including the morality, truth, justice and patriotism. It is further noted that it is the duty of every good citizen, when called upon by police and other law enforcement personnel, to assist the officer in performing such duties.

The Board appreciates that law enforcement and protective services personnel have a basic duty to protect the welfare of minors, particularly pertaining to physical and sexual abuse.

The Board directs the Superintendent to prepare administrative regulations which will facilitate law enforcement in the performance of their duties in an orderly manner.

The Superintendent is further directed to ensure that the regulations provide for the protection of fundamental constitutional rights of pupils and provides for parent/guardian notification.

DISCUSSION:

Board Policy and Administrative Regulation No. 4607 are proposed to provide policy and procedure on the proper use of funding received by the District through federal grants.

All grants awarded by the federal government, including formula grants and discretionary grants, are subject to the requirements contained in the Office of Management and Budget's (OMB) Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (commonly called "Uniform Guidance"), as specified in 2 CFR 200.0-200.521 and Appendices I-XII. The Uniform Guidance, adopted in December 2014, includes new provisions but primarily consolidates guidance from earlier OMB circulars.

The proposed attached Board Policy and accompanying detailed Administrative Regulation complies with the Uniform Guidance and document the required controls and procedures required to manage grant funds received from the Federal Government.

The proposed new Board Policy No. 4607 was reviewed by members of the Curriculum Board Subcommittee at their May 29, 2018, meeting.

FEDERAL GRANT FUNDS

PURPOSE: To establish a policy for goods or services purchased with federal funds.

The Governing Board recognizes the District's responsibility to maintain fiscal integrity and transparency in the use of all funds awarded through federal grants. The district shall comply with all requirements detailed in any grant agreement with an awarding agency and with the federal Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards specified in 2 CFR 200.0-200.521 and any stricter state laws and district policy.

Any goods or services purchased with federal funds shall be reasonable in cost and necessary for the proper and efficient performance or administration of the program.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district's financial management systems and procedures provide for the following: (2 CFR 200.302)

- 1. Identification in district accounts of each federal award received and expended and the federal program under which it was received.
- 2. Accurate, current, and complete disclosure of the financial and performance results of each federal award or program in accordance with the reporting requirements of 2 CFR 200.327 and 200.328
- 3. Records and supporting documentation that adequately identify the source and application of funds for federally funded activities, including information pertaining to federal awards, authorizations, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, expenditures, income, and interest.
- 4. Effective controls and accountability for all funds, property, and other assets and assurance that all assets are used solely for authorized purposes.
- 5. Comparison of actual expenditures with budgeted amounts for each federal award.
- 6. Written procedures to implement provisions governing payments as specified in 2 CFR 200.305.
- 7. Written procedures for determining the allowability of costs in accordance with 2 CFR 200.400-200.475 and the terms and conditions of the federal grant award.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement appropriate internal control processes to reasonably assure that transactions are properly executed, recorded, and accounted for so that the district can prepare reliable financial statements and federal reports, maintain

accountability over assets, and demonstrate compliance with federal laws, regulations, and conditions of the federal award. (2 CFR 200.61, 200.62, 200.303)

Equipment purchased with federal funds shall be properly inventoried and adequately maintained to safeguard against loss, damage, or theft of the property.

All staff involved in the administration or implementation of programs and activities supported by federal funds shall receive information and training on the allowable use of federal funds, purchasing procedures, and reporting processes commensurate with their duties.

The district shall submit performance reports to the awarding agency in accordance with the schedule and indicators required for that federal grant by law and the awarding agency. As required, such reports may include a comparison of actual accomplishments to the objectives of the federal award, the relationship between financial data and performance accomplishments, the reasons that established goals were not met if applicable, cost information to demonstrate cost effective practices, analysis and explanation of any cost overruns or high unit costs, and other relevant information. The final performance report shall be submitted within 90 days after the ending date of the grant. (2 CFR 200.301, 200.328)

FEDERAL GRANT FUNDS

PURPOSE:

To ensure the lawful expenditure of any federal formula or discretionary grant funds awarded to the district, the Superintendent or designee shall comply with the requirements of the Office of Management and Budget's Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (the "Uniform Guidance"), as contained in 2 CFR 200.0-200.521 and Appendices I-XII.

Allowable Costs

Prior to obligating or spending any federal grant funds, the Superintendent or designee shall determine whether a proposed purchase is an allowable expenditure in accordance with 2 CFR 200.400-200.475 and the terms and conditions of the award. He/she shall also determine whether the expense is a direct or indirect cost as defined in 2 CFR 200.413 and 200.414 and, if the purchase will benefit other programs not included in the grant award, the appropriate share to be allocated to the federal grant.

The Superintendent or designee shall review and approve all transactions involving federal grant funds and shall ensure the proper coding of expenditures consistent with the California School Accounting Manual.

Period of Performance

All obligations of federal funds shall occur on or between the beginning and ending dates of the grant project and shall be paid no later than 90 days after the end of the funding period, unless specifically authorized by the grant award to be carried over beyond the initial term of the grant. (2 CFR 200.77, 200.308, 200.309, 200.343)

Procurement

When procuring goods and services with a federal grant, the Superintendent or designee shall comply with the standards contained in 2 CFR 200.317-200.326 and Appendix II of Part 200, or with any applicable state law or district policy that is more restrictive.

As appropriate to encourage greater economy and efficiency, the Superintendent or designee shall avoid acquisition of unnecessary or duplicative items, give consideration to consolidating or breaking out procurements, analyze lease versus purchase alternatives, consider entering into an interagency agreement for procurement of common or shared goods and services, and/or use federal excess or surplus property. (2 CFR 200.318)

The procurement of goods or services with federal funds shall be conducted in a manner that provides full and open competition in accordance with state laws and district regulations and the

following requirements:

- 1. Any purchase of supplies or services in which the aggregate amount does not exceed the "micro-purchase" threshold of \$3,500 as specified in 48 CFR 2.101 effective June 13, 2018, may be awarded without soliciting competitive quotes, provided that the district considers the price to be reasonable and maintains written evidence of this reasonableness in the record of all micro-purchases. (2 CFR 200.67, 200.320)
- 2. For any purchase that exceeds the micro-purchase threshold but is less than the bid limit required by Public Contract Code 20111, the Superintendent or designee shall utilize "small-purchase" procedures that include obtaining price or rate quotes from an adequate number of qualified sources. (2 CFR 200.320)
- 3. Contracts for goods or services over the bid limits required by Public Contract Code 20111 shall be awarded pursuant to California law and BP 8101 Purchasing and Supply Management, unless exempt from bidding under the law.
- 4. If a purchase is exempt from bidding and the district's solicitation is by a request for proposals, the award may be made by either a fixed-price or cost-reimbursement type contract awarded to the entity whose proposal is most advantageous to the program, with price and other factors considered. (2 CFR 200.320)
- 5. Procurement by noncompetitive proposals (sole sourcing) may be used only when the item is available exclusively from a single source, the need or emergency will not permit a delay resulting from competitive solicitation, the awarding agency expressly authorizes sole sourcing in response to the district's request, and/or competition is determined inadequate after solicitation of a number of sources. (2 CFR 200.320)
- 6. Time and materials type contracts may be used only after a determination that no other contract is suitable and if the contract includes a ceiling price that the contractor exceeds at its own risk. Time and materials type contract means a contract for which the cost is the sum of the actual cost of materials and direct labor hours charged at fixed hourly rates that reflect wages, general administrative expenses, and profit. (200.328)

For any purchase of \$25,000 or more, the Superintendent or designee shall verify that any vendor which is used to procure goods or services is not excluded or disqualified by the federal government. (2 CFR 180.220, 200.213)

All solicitations shall incorporate a clear and accurate description of the technical requirements for the material, product, or service to be procured. Such description shall not, in competitive procurements, contain features which unduly restrict competition. The description shall avoid detailed product specifications to the extent possible, but may include a statement of the qualitative nature of the material, product, or service to be procured and, when necessary, shall set forth those minimum essential characteristics and standards to which it must conform if it is to satisfy its intended use. When it is impractical or not economical to make a clear and accurate description of the technical requirements, a brand name or equivalent description may be used to

define the performance or other salient requirements of procurement, clearly stating the specific features of the named brand which must be met by offers. In addition, every solicitation shall identify all requirements which the offer must fulfill and any other factors to be used in evaluating bids or proposals. (2 CFR 200.319)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain sufficient records to document the procurement, including, but not limited to, the rationale for the method of procurement, selection of the contract type, contractor selection or rejection, and the basis for the contract price. (2 CFR 200.318)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all contracts for purchases using federal grant funds contain the applicable contract provisions described in Appendix II to Part 200 - Contract Provisions for Non-Federal Entity Contracts Under Federal Awards. (2 CFR 200.326)

Capital Expenditures

The Superintendent or designee shall obtain prior written approval from the awarding agency before using federal funds to make capital expenditures, including the acquisition of land, facilities, equipment, and intellectual property and expenditures to make additions, improvements, modifications, replacements, rearrangements, reinstallations, renovations, or alterations to capital assets that materially increase their value or useful life. (2 CFR 200.12, 200.13, 200.20, 200.33, 200.48, 200.58, 200.89, 200.313, 200.439)

Conflict of Interest

No Governing Board member, district employee, or district representative shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by federal funds if he/she has a real or apparent conflict of interest, such as when he/she or a member of his/her immediate family, his/her partner, or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of them has a financial interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract. Such persons are prohibited from soliciting or accepting gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors or subcontractors unless the gift is an unsolicited item of nominal value. (2 CFR 200.318)

Employees engaged in the selection, award, and administration of contracts shall also comply with Board Policy 4605 - Conflict of Interest Code.

Cash Management

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure the district's compliance with 2 CFR 200.305 pertaining to payments and cash management, including compliance with applicable methods and procedures that minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds to the district and the district's disbursement of funds. (2 CFR 200.305)

When authorized by law, the district may receive advance payments of federal grant funds, limited to the minimum amounts needed and timed in accordance with the actual immediate cash

requirements of the district for carrying out the purpose of the program or project. Except under specified conditions, the district shall maintain the advance payments in an interest-bearing account. The district shall remit interest earned on the advanced payment to the awarding agency on an annual basis, but may retain interest amounts specified in 2 CFR 200.305 for administrative expenses. (2 CFR 200.305)

When required by the awarding agency, the district shall instead submit a request for reimbursement of actual expenses incurred. The district may also request reimbursement as an alternative to receiving advance payments. (2 CFR 200.305)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain source documentation supporting the expenditure of federal funds, such as invoices, time sheets, payroll stubs, or other appropriate documentation.

Personnel

All district employees who are paid in full or in part with federal funds, including employees whose salary is paid with state or local funds but is used to meet a required match or in-kind contribution to a federal program, shall document the amount of time they spend on grant activities. (2 CFR 200.430)

Records

Except as otherwise provided in 2 CFR 200.333, or where state law or district policy requires a longer retention period, financial records, supporting documents, statistical records, and all other district records related to a federal award shall be retained for a period of three years from the date of submission of the final expenditure report or, for a federal award that is renewed quarterly or annually, from the date of the submission of the quarterly or annual financial report. (2 CFR 200.333)

Audits

Whenever the district expends \$750,000 or more in federal grant funds during a fiscal year, it shall arrange for either a single audit or a program-specific audit in accordance with 2 CFR 200.507 or 200.514. (2 CFR 200.501)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the audit meets the requirements specified in 2 CFR 200.500-200.521.

Specified records pertaining to the audit of federal funds expended by the district shall be transmitted to the clearinghouse designated by the Federal Office of Management and Budget and shall be made available for public inspection. Such records shall be transmitted within 30 days after receipt of the auditor's report or within nine months after the end of the audit period, whichever is sooner, unless a longer period is agreed to in advance by the federal agency or a different period is specified in a program-specific audit guide. (2 CFR 200.512)

In the event that the audit identifies any deficiency, the Superintendent or designee shall

promptly act to either correct the identified deficiency, produce recommended improvements, or demonstrate that the audit finding is invalid or does not warrant action. (2 CFR 200.26, 200.508, 200.511)

DISCUSSION:

Section 5322 of the California Education Code states as follows:

"Whenever an election is ordered, the governing board of the district or the board or officer authorized by this code to make such designations shall, concurrently with or after the order of election but not less than 123 days prior to the date of the election in the case of an election on a measure, including a bond measure, by resolution delivered to the county superintendent of schools and the officer conducting the election, or, in the case of an election on a measure, only to the officer conducting the election, specify the following, or such of the following as he or she or it may have authority to designate:

- (a) The date of the election.
- (b) The purpose of the election.

The resolution, or resolutions, shall be known as 'specifications of the election order' and shall set forth the authority for ordering the election, the authority for the specification of the election order, the signature of the officer or the clerk of the board by law authorized to make the designations therein contained, and, in the case of an election on a measure, the exact wording of the measure as it is to appear on the ballot."

It will be necessary for the Board to adopt Resolution No. 3644 – Resolution, Order of Election and Specifications of the Election Order, consolidating the 2018 Board Member elections in Areas 1, 3 and 6.

Approve Resolution No. 3652 declaring the intention of the Governing Board to convey an easement in a portion of the Buchanan Educational Center property required for the installation and operation of electrical facilities to support a communications tower and related improvements, and scheduling a Public Hearing on the proposed conveyance. Requires a 2/3 majority vote.

DISCUSSION:

The District has entered into a License Agreement with MSA Limited Partnership, d/b/a Verizon Wireless ("Verizon"), to install and operate a communications tower and related facilities on the east side of Veterans Memorial Stadium, near Minnewawa Avenue. In order to supply electrical power to the Verizon facilities, PG&E and Verizon have requested that the District convey public utility easements to connect the Verizon facilities to PG&E's electrical power facilities. This easement is more particularly described in the attached Exhibit A.

The Resolution is provided for in Education Code section 17556, et al., which requires the Governing Board to declare its intention to dedicate the easement and set a Public Hearing at a future meeting. The proposed resolution would set a Public Hearing date and time of 6:45 p.m. during the July 18, 2018, Board meeting.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CONVEY EASEMENT IN REAL PROPERTY TO THE PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY

WHEREAS, Clovis Unified School District (District) owns certain real property located on the west side of North Minnewawa Avenue, north of its intersection with East Nees Avenue in the City of Clovis, County of Fresno, State of California, bearing Assessor's Parcel Numbers (APN) 560-020-17 and 560-020-18 (Property); and

WHEREAS, the District has entered into that certain Option and License Agreement dated March 21, 2018, with Fresno MSA Limited Partnership, d/b/a Verizon Wireless (Verizon), for the installation of telecommunications facilities on a portion of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the District has received a request from Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to dedicate a public utilities easement across a portion of the Property as set forth in Exhibit A (Easement Area) for the purpose of constructing and maintaining underground electric facilities to serve the Verizon facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Easement Area is an approximately 400-square-foot portion of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Easement Area is not now and will not at the time of the proposed delivery of possession and title to PG&E be needed exclusively for classroom or other school purposes by the District; and

WHEREAS, the construction and maintenance of the public utilities improvements by PG&E will benefit the District; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to transfer ownership of said Easement Area to PG&E in that PG&E will construct and maintain the public utilities improvements; and

WHEREAS, California Education Code section 17556 et seq. provides that, before conveying the Easement Area to PG&E, this Board must adopt, by not less than 2/3 vote of all of its members, a resolution declaring its intention to convey the easement, which resolution shall describe the Easement Area proposed to be conveyed in such manner to identify it, specify the purposes for which and the terms upon which it will be conveyed, and shall fix a time not less

than 10 days thereafter for a public meeting of the Board to be held at its regular meeting place for a Public Hearing upon the question of making the conveyance; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Resolution is to satisfy the requirements of Education Code section 17556 et seq., referred to above.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board adopts the foregoing recitals as true and correct.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the Governing Board hereby declares its intention to convey the Easement Area to PG&E for public utilities purposes, the description and illustration of which are as set forth in the attached Exhibit A.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that on July 18, 2018, at 6:45 p.m., at its regular place of meeting, this Board shall hold a Public Hearing upon the question of making the proposed conveyance of the Easement Area to PG&E.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the District's Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, Assistant Superintendent of Facility Services or their designee are authorized and directed to give notice of the adoption of this Resolution and of the time and place of holding the meeting and hearing by posting copies of this Resolution and publishing a hearing notice as required by law.



Title: Annual Submission of Instructional Minutes Waiver for Transitional Kindergarten

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the District's annual submission of a waiver request to the California State Board of Education, which would allow Kindergarten instructional minutes at some school sites to vary from Transitional Kindergarten instructional minutes at those same sites, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

Clovis Unified School District offers Kindergarten and Transitional Kindergarten (TK) in its elementary school programs. The TK program provides students with developmentally appropriate, experimental activities and helps prepare them for the more academically rigorous second year of Kindergarten.

As part of the early primary program, some elementary schools within Clovis Unified offer extended day programs for Kindergarten students as outlined in Board Policy No. 1302. These schools choose to offer extended day Kindergarten programs based on the needs of their student population.

However, according to the law, Kindergarten and Transitional Kindergarten programs must be equal in instructional minutes, unless a waiver of this provision is granted through the California State Board of Education. Requiring TK students to attend school for an extended day based on the minutes of the Kindergarten program would not be in the best educational interest of Clovis Unified's youngest students.

Thus, the District is seeking a waiver that would allow TK programs at selected school sites to operate with instructional minutes that are less than those selected school sites extended Kindergarten programs.

Authorize the Superintendent or designee to approve and submit Clovis Unified School District's Local Education Agency Plan (LEAP) for the 2018-19 school year.

DISCUSSION:

Pursuant to the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Local Education Agencies (LEAs) that apply for ESSA funds are required to complete the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), the LCAP Local Education Agency Plan Addendum (LEAP Addendum), and the Consolidated Application (ConApp). The LCAP, in conjunction with the LEAP and the ConApp, serve to meet the ESSA LEAP requirement. CUSD's LCAP is intended to reflect our annual goals, actions, services and expenditures within a fixed three-year planning cycle. CUSD must include a plan summary for the LCAP each year.

The LCAP and LEAP Addendum documents and communicates Clovis Unified's LCAP actions, services and expenditures to support student outcomes and overall performance. The LCAP is a three-year plan, which is reviewed and updated annually, as required. Charter schools may complete the LCAP to align with the term of the charter school's budget, typically one year, which is submitted to the school's authorizer. The LCAP and Annual Update Template must be completed by all LEAs each year.

Clovis Unified's LCAP describes the District's goals and specific actions to achieve those goals for all students and each student group identified by the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) – ethnic, socioeconomically disadvantaged, English learners, foster youth, pupils with disabilities, and homeless youth – for each of the State priorities and any locally identified priorities.

The proposed services and actions affirmed by attendees at meetings and forums are designed around the following seven focus areas identified by parents, students, employees and community members:

- Parent Involvement and Engagement: Eliminating barriers and training parents to access and support their child's education through increasing CUSD Parent Academies throughout the District and school sites.
- 2. Safety: Maintaining campus environments that allow students to feel secure and focus on their education with the addition of School Resource Officers and extending hours of operation.
- 3. College and Career Readiness: Preparing students for the world after high school to increase their long-term engagement in school and success over time.
- 4. Social and Emotional Well-Being of Students: Provide additional school and district

- psychologists who will support students' social and emotional well-being and the District's newly written Comprehensive Wellness Plan.
- 5. Services to Students: At-risk students need more focused attention by caring educators to ensure that they stay in school and succeed academically. Often, families of at-risk students also struggle with accessing the educational environment and need additional assistance and support to do so.
- 6. Intervention Support: One-on-one and targeted intervention is needed for students at risk of not achieving grade level standards.
- 7. Curriculum and Instruction: All students, including at-risk students, are more likely to succeed when instructional materials are sufficient, staff is highly qualified and trained, and instructional strategies and tools are innovative.

Title: Annual Agreement with Corwin, a SAGE Company, for Visible Learning Professional Development

Authorize the Superintendent or designee to enter into an agreement with Corwin, a SAGE Company, to provide the Visible Learning Professional Development District-wide, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

Aim I for the District's Strategic Plan is to "Maximize Achievement for ALL students." One way to do this for Clovis Unified students is through effective professional development for teachers.

The Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability Department is recommending that Clovis Unified implement Professor and Education Researcher John Hattie's Visible Learning Plus program, which is provided by Corwin, a SAGE Company. Hattie's research, centered on classroom instruction, has led to a framework that allows school teams to determine the instructional needs of their students. Hattie's Visible Learning Plus is an in-depth coaching model designed for school teams to systematically examine effective instructional practices in order to determine impact on student achievement and learning. By considering the effects of the practices of teachers and leaders, schools will be able to make substantial gains in student achievement.

Visible Learning consultants have designed a customized program of implementation and coaching through which professional development will focus on administrator and teacher coaching to impact student achievement at 14 schools. Approximately 250 teachers will be trained and coached using the consultant and District facilitators.

Funding is provided entirely through Staff Development, not to exceed \$81,500.

Title: Provisional Internship Permit

Approve the Provisional Internship Permit for recommended teaching candidates, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

The Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since these individuals will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the Provisional Internship Permit information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to candidates on a Provisional Internship Permit are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting Provisional Internship Permit requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicants in the identified positions was made public. The public notice must include the following information: (1) the name of the applicant(s); (2) the assignment in which the applicant(s) will be employed including subject(s), grade level(s), and school site; and (3) a statement that the applicant(s) will be employed on the basis of a Provisional Internship Permit. Clovis Unified intends to submit a Provisional Internship Permit request for the following teacher candidates, contingent upon administration and Board approval:



Title: Annual Agreement with School Services of California for Legislative Consulting and Advocacy to Support California School Funding Coalition

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve an annual agreement with School Services of California (SSC) for legislative consulting and advocacy.

DISCUSSION:

The District created the California School Funding Coalition (CSFC) in April 2013. The CSFC and SSC work together to ensure every public school in California receives the funding necessary to provide a high-quality education for all students. Consultants provide support with Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) implementation issues, in addition to coordination and recruitment of members in the Coalition and Legislative and advocacy services. Currently, there are 48 school districts participating in the CSFC.

The current agreement with SSC expires June 30, 2018, and in order for the Coalition to continue to utilize these services, it will be necessary for the Board to renew the existing agreement.

This agreement is for one year beginning July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019.

Each order drawn on the funds of a school district shall be signed by at least a majority of the members of the governing board of the district, or by a person or persons authorized by the governing board to sign orders in its name. DISCUSSION:

In March 2016, Fresno Unified School District advertised for bids for the purchase of musical instruments. All provisions of the Public Contract Code were followed by Fresno Unified awarding a bid for the purchase of said items.

Fresno Unified awarded a piggyback contract for the purchase of musical instruments through American Music Co., Gottschalk Music Center, Harvard House Music, Horn Shop and Midwest Musical Imports. The contract is valid through June 2019. Orders will only be placed against this bid as long as it remains in the best interest of the District to do so.

Approval of this piggyback purchase would allow for the expedited purchase of new musical instruments for District VAPA programs. The piggyback allows for the purchase of new instruments which meet all District standards. This would allow Clovis Unified to receive negotiated cost savings and save order lead time. It is recommended that the Board authorize the purchase of musical instruments through the piggyback process.

Section 20118 of the California Public Contract Code provides that the Governing Board of a school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize the purchase of equipment, materials, and supplies from another public corporation or agency if the other public corporation or agency has complied with the Public Contract Code regarding the purchase of similar equipment, materials and supplies.

Adopt Resolution No. 3647 authorizing a debt service estimate to be provided to the County of Fresno respecting unsold general obligation refunding bonds for fiscal year 2018-19.

DISCUSSION:

The District has the opportunity to refinance for interest rate savings and tax restructuring purposes some of its outstanding general obligation bonds, previously issued pursuant to 2004 and 2012 voter-approved bond measures. The refinancing is expected to require a tax levy on the 2018-19 tax rolls because capital appreciation bonds will be replaced by current interest bonds. The county is expected to set tax rates for fiscal year 2018-19 before refinancing is accomplished. As such, it is necessary for the District to adopt a resolution requesting the county to include an estimate of the tax rate needed to provide payment of the District's 2018 refunding bonds, which are not yet issued, but are expected to be issued in fiscal year 2018-19. The tax rate to be set will maintain the commitment to our community of a tax of \$153.35 per \$100,000 assessed value.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING DEBT SERVICE ESTIMATE TO BE PROVIDED TO THE COUNTY OF FRESNO RESPECTING UNSOLD GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-19

WHEREAS, bond elections have been duly and regularly held in the Clovis Unified School District (the "District"), including on March 2, 2004, and on June 5, 2012, under the procedures specified in Proposition 39 (Article XIII A Section 1 paragraph (b) of the California Constitution) for the purpose of submitting bond measures both known as "Measure A" (together, the "Bond Measures") to the qualified electors of the District authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds (the "Bonds"), and more than 55% of the votes cast at said elections were in favor of the issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board has issued Bonds pursuant to the Bond Measures in multiple series, including its General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2004, Series A dated December 15, 2004, in the aggregate original principal amount of \$119,998,286.10 (the "Series 2004A Bonds) and its General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2012, Series C dated September 3, 2014, in the aggregate original principal amount of \$64,995,504.55 (the "Series 2012C Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the District expects that it will authorize the issuance of refunding bonds (the "2018 Bonds") to refinance for savings certain outstanding maturities of the Series 2004A Bonds and the Series 2012C Bonds, including certain maturities that were issued as capital appreciation bonds, and as a result of the refinancing will require a tax to be placed on the 2018-19 tax roll to provide for amortization of the 2018 Bonds in fiscal year 2018-19; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 15252 of the California Education Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno (the "County") is required to levy a tax for payment of bonds which have been authorized but not yet issued, provided that the Governing Board of the District informs the County of its intention to issue such bonds prior to the next tax levy; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board wishes at this time to authorize District staff to make certain communications with the County respecting the foregoing.

THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Governing Board hereby finds, determines, declares and resolves as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The Governing Board hereby finds and determines that the foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Intention to Issue Refunding Bonds. The Governing Board hereby expresses its current expectation that it will cause the issuance of approximately \$10 million aggregate principal amount of 2018 Bonds during Fiscal Year 2018-19. The 2018 Bonds are currently expected to be issued in fiscal year 2018-19 after the time that the tax rates are set by the County, to refinance certain maturities of the Series 2004A Bonds and the Series 2012C Bonds. Although the District has previously provided a debt service schedule to the County with respect to the Series 2004A Bonds and the Series 2012C Bonds, due primarily to the refinancing of capital appreciation bonds and replacing them with bonds which bear current interest, it is expected that the refinancing will require an additional tax on the 2018-19 tax roll.

Section 3. Information to County. The Superintendent, the Deputy Superintendent, the Associate Superintendent, Administrative Services, or the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services of the District are hereby authorized to (a) file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, and (b) provide, or cause to be provided, an estimate of debt service for the 2018 Bonds to the Auditor-Controller of the County at the earliest possible date following the adoption of this Resolution.

Section 4. Request to County to Levy Tax. The Board of Supervisors of the County is hereby requested, in accordance with Section 15252-15254, to adopt a tax rate which takes into account the 2018 Bonds expected to be sold during Fiscal Year 2018-19, based upon estimated debt service schedules prepared by officers of the District or the District's consultants, and to levy a tax in Fiscal Year 2018-19 on all taxable property in the District sufficient to pay said estimated debt service. The proceeds of such tax shall be deposited into the debt service fund of the District established pursuant to the Education Code for bonds of the District.

Section. 5. Application of Tax Proceeds. In the event that the 2018 Bonds of the District are not sold during Fiscal Year 2018-19, or sold in such amount and on such terms that the proceeds of the tax requested in Section 4 hereof, or any portion thereof, is not required for payment of debt service due on the 2018 Bonds, or the Series 2004A Bonds or the Series 2012C Bonds, or payment of other outstanding bonds of the District payable from debt service funds of the District, this Board hereby requests that the Auditor-Controller, or other appropriate official of the County, cause the remaining proceeds of the respective tax to be held in the District's debt service fund and applied to debt service on outstanding general obligation bonds of the District coming due in fiscal year 2019-20.

Section 6. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, the District has received a request from Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to dedicate a public utilities easement across a portion of the Property as set forth in Exhibit A (Easement Area) for the purpose of constructing and maintaining underground electric facilities to serve the Verizon facilities and continuing to serve District facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Easement Area is an approximately 400-square-foot portion of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Easement Area is not now and will not at the time of the proposed delivery of possession and title to PG&E be needed exclusively for classroom or other school purposes by the District; and

WHEREAS, the construction and maintenance of the public utilities improvements by PG&E will benefit the District; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to transfer ownership of said Easement Area to PG&E in that PG&E will construct and maintain the public utilities improvements; and

WHEREAS, on June 13, 2018, this Board adopted its Resolution No. 3652 declaring its intention, in accordance with California Education Code section 17556 et seq., to convey the Easement Area to PG&E, and directed the District's Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, Assistant Superintendent of Facility Services or their designee to give notice of the adoption of the Resolution and of the time and place of holding the required meeting and hearing by posting copies of said Resolution and publishing a hearing notice as required by law; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting of July 18, 2018, this Board held a Public Hearing upon the question of making the proposed conveyance of said Easement Area to PG&E, and no objections to the proposed conveyance were received.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board adopts the foregoing recitals as true and correct.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that pursuant to Education Code section 17556, et seq., the District hereby conveys the Easement Area to PG&E for public utilities purposes.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the District's Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, Assistant Superintendent of Facility Services or their designee are authorized and directed to execute an appropriate Easement Deed or similar instrument or instruments conveying the Easement Area to PG&E.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
