2. Center for Advanced Research and Technology (CART) (Sandoval)

During the CART Board of Directors' meeting on June 20, CUSD Director of Budget and Finance Susan Rutledge, who was recently appointed to serve as Assistant Superintendent of

Business Services effective July 1, 2017, made a presentation on the CART 2017-18 Adopted Budget. The Directors approved the Clovis Unified salary settlements for the employee groups associated with the CART administrative salary schedule. Finally, a potential contract with Geekwise Academy for technology training was summarized.

3. Curriculum (Budd, Hovsepian, Van Volkinburg)

Members of the Curriculum Board Subcommittee met at Boris Elementary School on June 21 where they were able to observe students engaged in group and individual learning activities in the school's innovative "behind the glass" classroom. Board Members Hovespian and Van Volkinburg noted that all the students' needs were being met in the classroom, including the furniture choices and arrangements that were customized for each student to best support their learning. After the classroom observation, members reviewed the two written staff reports – Counseling Services and Transition Team report and Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) Progress report – that were presented to the full Board in their agenda materials for the June 28, 2017, Governing Board meeting. Also discussed were Board Policies No. 2410, 9208 and 9211 and Administrative Regulation No. 3401. Board Policies No. 2410, 9208 and 9211 were presented for Action at the June 28 Governing Board meeting, while the verbiage of Administrative Regulation No. 3401 was updated based on the conversation that took place during the meeting.

4. Facilities (Fogg, Heryford, Sandoval)

During the Facilities Board Subcommittee meeting on June 21, members reviewed the design, bid and construction reports, change order reports, and bond measure finance reports. Also discussed was the City of Clovis' July 4th Freedom Fest fireworks celebration taking place at Lamonica Stadium on the Clovis High School campus. Finally, members reviewed potential sites for an elementary school in the southeast area of the District's boundaries including possible sites at Shields and DeWolf avenues and Fowler and Clinton avenues.

Authorize the Superintendent or designee to enter into an Early Participation Program (EPP) with the College Board to allow intermediate and high school students to take the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Tests (PSAT/NMSQT).

DISCUSSION:

Aim I of Clovis Unified's Strategic Plan is to "Maximize Achievement for ALL Students." One of the action efforts included in Aim I is the preparation of students for college and career readiness, including participation in college-readiness assessments. Two college readiness assessments are the PSAT 8/9 and PSAT/NMSQT. Students receive results from these assessments which help them to prepare for the actual assessment and serve as an indicator as to which secondary courses best meet their individual needs. Intermediate school students will take the PSAT 8/9 during their eighth grade year. High school students will take the same test during their sophomore or junior year.

If approved, Clovis Unified will pay exam fees which will allow students to participate twice in college-readiness exams during their secondary school experience.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

The cost of administering the PSAT 8/9 is \$24,570, for which funding is included in the 2017-18 Assessment Department Budget. Funding for the PSAT/NMSQT is \$43,147 which will be funded through the College and Career Readiness Grant.

The Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability Department is recommending that Clovis Unified implement Professor and Education Researcher John Hattie's Visible Learning Plus program, which is provided by Corwin, a SAGE Company. Hattie's research, centered on classroom instruction, has led to a framework that allows school teams to determine the instructional needs of their students. Hattie's Visible Learning Plus is an in-depth coaching model designed for school teams to systematically examine effective instructional practices in order to determine impact on student achievement and learning. By considering the effects of the practices of teachers and leaders, schools will be able to make substantial gains in student achievement.

Following the initial year of Visible Learning program implementation in 2017-18, Visible Learning consultants have designed a customized program of instruction and coaching through which professional development will be sustained and expanded using District facilitators to support each new and continuing school site.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

Funding is provided entirely through the Educator Effectiveness Grant, not to exceed \$117,000.

ADDENDUM TO CART OPERATING AGREEMENT

THIS ADDENDUM ("Addendum") to the CART Operating Agreement dated March 25, 2015 ("Operating Agreement"), is made and entered into as of July 12, 2017, between FRESNO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT and CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, each, a "District," and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Districts," and the CENTER FOR ADVANCED RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY, hereinafter referred to as "CART."

Notwithstanding any provisions in the Operating Agreement to the contrary, the following provisions shall prevail:

- 1. <u>Duration.</u> The duration of the Operating Agreement is hereby extended for the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 fiscal years, commencing on July 1, 2016 and ending on June 30, 2018. Thereafter, the approval of the annual budget by each District and by CART shall be deemed to operate as an extension of the Operating Agreement for an additional fiscal year, commencing on July 1 and ending on June 30 of each successive year.
- 2. <u>District's Payment of Fees to CART</u>. The Districts hereby ratify the fee that each District paid to CART in the amount of \$786,557 for the 2016-2017 fiscal year. The Districts agree that they shall each pay a fee in the amount of \$807,951.14 to CART for the 2017-2018 fiscal year. This amount shall be paid in twelve (12) equal monthly installments of \$67,329.26 each. This amount shall be increased, effective July 1 of each renewal term of the Operating Agreement thereafter, by the percentage of the increase in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for California, as published by the California Department of Finance. Should there be any reduction in CART's receipt of Fresno CTE Operations Funding, the Districts will share equally to cover the amount of any reduced funding.
- 3. CART's Payments to Clovis Unified. CART hereby ratifies the fee it paid to Clovis Unified School District for the 2016-2017 fiscal year in the sum of \$100,000 for administrative services, and in the sum of \$75,000 for maintenance services rendered by Clovis Unified School District. CART agrees to pay to Clovis Unified School District in the 2017-2018 fiscal year the sum of \$100,000 for administrative services, and the sum of \$75,000 for maintenance services to be rendered by Clovis Unified School District. CART shall pay Clovis Unified \$25,000 each quarter (September 1, December 1, March 1, and June 1) for administrative services. CART shall pay Clovis Unified \$18,750 each quarter (September 1, December 1, March 1, and June 1) for maintenance services. Maintenance services include routine restricted maintenance for the inside of the building, including maintenance of restrooms, plumbing electrical, floors, and air conditioning. Maintenance services do not include deferred maintenance and items such as major plumbing or air conditioner replacement. The annual amount shall be adjusted effective July 1 of each fiscal year of this Agreement; the adjustment will be based on an actual cost estimate, but will not exceed a 5% increase from the prior year.

CART further ratifies the fee it paid to Clovis Unified School District for the 2016-2017 fiscal year in the sum of \$22,241 for landscaping and grounds maintenance, which includes mowing the grass, trimming trees, and minor repairs to fencing, signage,

sprinklers, and concrete and asphalt. CART agrees to pay Clovis Unified in the 2017-2018 fiscal year the sum of \$23,353 for landscaping and grounds maintenance. Payments will be made in equal amounts each quarter (September 1, December 1, March 1 and June 1). The annual amount shall be adjusted effective July 1 of each fiscal year of this Agreement; the adjustment will be based on an actual cost estimate, but will not exceed a 5% increase from the prior year.

- 4. Computer Refresh Plan. CART has developed a five year plan to provide cutting edge technology for students. CART will review and update the plan each year in order to provide for the following five years. The plan will include a proposal for sharing of expenses among CART, Fresno Unified and Clovis Unified. The plan and the proposal for sharing expenses must be presented by CART to the Districts by February 15 each year and thereafter must be approved by the Districts before it can be implemented. The Districts agree to each pay \$100,000 during the 2017-2018 school year towards the technology plan. Adjustments to this annual amount will be effective July 1 of each fiscal year of this Agreement and will incorporate CART's technology plan.
- 5. <u>Teachers</u>. The parties will work together to evaluate and determine the number of teachers needed and the number of teachers to be provided by each District each fiscal year.
- 6. <u>Amendment</u>. The terms of this Addendum shall not be amended in any manner except by written agreement signed by the parties.
- 7. Other Terms. All other terms and provisions of the Operating Agreement shall remain in full force and effect for the term of this Addendum and each renewal term of the Operating Agreement thereafter.

Title: Provisional Internship Permits

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the Provisional Internship Permits for recommended teaching candidates, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

The Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy, yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since these individuals will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the Provisional Internship Permit information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to candidates on a Provisional Internship Permit are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting Provisional Internship Permit requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicants in the identified positions was made public. The public notice must include the following information: (1) the name of the applicants; (2) the assignment in which the applicants will be employed including subject(s), grade level(s), and school site; and (3) a statement that the applicants will be employed on the basis of a Provisional Internship Permit. Clovis Unified intends to submit Provisional Internship Permit requests for the following teacher candidates, contingent upon administration and Board approval:

A Provisional Internship Permit shall be issued for one year and may not be renewed.

Lastly, public school districts must include a copy of the agenda item presented to the Governing Board of the district. The permit request must include a signed statement from the Superintendent or designee that the item was acted upon favorably. To assure that each permit request receives individual review and approval by the Governing Board, the agenda item may not be part of the Consent agenda.

Title: Authorization to Enter into Lease Agreement via Piggyback from Educational and Institutional Cooperative Services

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the purchase/lease of supplies and equipment utilizing various contracts from Educational and Institutional Cooperative Services (E&I) and recognize that it is in the District's best interest to make the purchase without advertising for bids pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 20118.

DISCUSSION:

E&I awarded piggyback contract bids for various items, with many contracts valid through 2022. Current and subsequent orders would only be placed against these bids as long as it remains in the best interest of the District.

Section 20118 of the California Public Contract Code provides that the Governing Board of a school district may authorize the purchase of equipment, materials, and supplies from another public corporation or agency without advertising for bids if the other public corporation or agency has complied with all Public Contract Codes regarding the purchase of similar equipment, materials and supplies.

E&I competitively bids for many types of services and supply contacts with organizations throughout the country. The District can utilize E&I Contract CNR01366 with Xerox. The E&I contract allows for reduced pricing on equipment needed by the District. Contract pricing is better with the E&I contract, cuts order lead time, and would result in a budget savings of approximately \$95,300 on needed equipment.

The lease agreement would also provide added value of approximately \$200,000 in District Graphic Arts Print Shop equipment and services, including high-volume units, sheet-fed modules, a shrink wrapper, Duplo cutter and variable data software solutions, in addition to providing copiers to be utilized to support special events such as CIF State Track and Field, State Swim and Dive, and State Cross Country Championships hosted by Clovis Unified. New site and department copiers are also included to increase efficiency.

The District will receive new site and department copiers as well as the new high volume copiers for the Print Shop. This new equipment will provide more efficient equipment at the sites and departments. The lease will be a five (5) year agreement with Xerox.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

Current monthly average cost is \$117,235.58. Proposed monthly average cost would be \$115,647.25, resulting in savings of approximately \$95,300 over a five (5) year term, as well as

approximately \$200,000 of added value in District Print Shop equipment and services over the current agreement. Included in the 2017-18 Adopted Budget.

Authorize the Superintendent or designee to approve the revised Clovis Unified Master Plan – A Guide to Services for English Learners, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

Pursuant to Education Code 62002.5, districts are required to develop and regularly revise the Master Plan that outlines and addresses the specific educational needs of limited-English-speaking students. In the spring of 2017, the Clovis Unified Master Plan – A Guide to Services for English Learners was revised to address and meet all current guidelines, as well as elements required by law, and reflect existing services offered by CUSD.

The revised plan was reviewed and developed by a team comprised of individuals from across the District, representing various departments, District-level parent committees and site representatives who possess an expertise in the area of English Learners. The document will be presented to and reviewed by the District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC), School Site Councils (SSC) and English Language Advisory Committees (ELAC) throughout the 2017-18 school year. All sites will receive additional training in the fall of 2017. Schools then present and review the document at their quarterly ELAC and SSC meetings. The revised document will be presented and reviewed with the DELAC and the District Advisory Committee (DAC) in the fall of 2017.

Title: Annual Memorandum of Understanding with the California Teaching Fellows Foundation

RECOMMENDATION:

Ratify a Memorandum of Understanding with the California Teaching Fellows Foundation (CTFF) effective August 21, 2017, through June 29, 2018, in order to provide additional instructional assistants and direct support to all students who qualify for Clovis Unified's Afterschool Education and Safety (ASES) program.

DISCUSSION:

CTFF, in partnership with California State University, Fresno (CSUF), offers scholarships to college students who are entering the field of education. These scholarships are offered to students attending CSUF in return for participating in the CTFF program. In Clovis Unified, CTFF students staff afterschool ASES programs at 11 of the District's 12 elementary Title I schools where the program is offered.

ASES programs are an extension of the regular school day through partnerships between schools and community agencies to provide afterschool education and enrichment such as literacy, academic enrichment, physical fitness activities, healthy nutrition based on State nutritional guidelines, and safe, constructive alternatives for students in grades kindergarten through grade six. Studies and District surveys both indicate that participation in the ASES program increases student achievement and improves academics and attendance. Teaching Fellows are supervised by a credentialed site certificated lead and receive ongoing

training provided by the CTFF and CUSD. The Teachings Fellows bring energetic, trained staff members to help students after the regular school day and, in turn, receive hands-on experiences in preparation for a career in education. The use of CTFF Teaching Fellows participants was first approved by the CUSD Governing Board in March 2007.

School contracts with CTFF are based upon the number of Teaching Fellows and the hours worked. The following is the distribution of resources by each school:

DISCUSSION:

AIM I of Clovis Unified's Strategic Plan is to "Maximize Achievement for ALL Students." This can be achieved through an enhancement of the CUSD Induction Program for new teachers, along with effective professional development for CUSD's Mentor Teachers.

New Teacher Center (NTC), a national non-profit organization dedicated to improving student learning by guiding a new generation of educators, offers a comprehensive system of teacher induction. Implementing this program will further develop CUSD's Induction Program and align with the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing's new Common Induction Standards.

In NTC's Mentor Professional Learning Series, CUSD Mentor Teachers will learn the critical knowledge, skills, and tools to initiate and maintain effective mentoring relationships with novice teachers in order to promote instructional growth. Mentor Teachers will gain a clear vision of high-quality teaching and mentoring that applies research-based best practices around adult learning theory.

The goal is to enhance the professional development of CUSD's Mentor Teachers in the support of novice teachers to create and sustain an optimal learning environment in which the diverse needs of each learner are addressed with an unwavering attention to equity and continuous academic, social, and emotional growth.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

\$138,800 to be paid through the CUSD Induction Budget and Educator Effectiveness Grant.

California Education Code section 17546 provides that the Governing Board of a school district may dispose of surplus property by conducting a public auction, conducted either by employees of the District or with a private auction firm in accordance with District Administrative Regulation No. 4603 – *Sale of Surplus Property*. Surplus items are reviewed by appropriate District staff and deemed unacceptable for current District use. Surplus equipment is not of use to other District sites, programs, or departments, and in this case is unaligned with the Board adopted curriculum.

Education Code section 17546 also states: If the Board, by a unanimous vote of those members present, finds that the property is of insufficient value to defray the costs of arranging a sale, the property may be donated to a charitable organization deemed appropriate by the Board.

EDUCATION CODE 42632

Each order drawn on the funds of a school district shall be signed by at least a majority of the members of the governing board of the district, or by a person or persons authorized by the governing board to sign orders in its name. No person other than an officer or employee of the district shall be authorized to sign orders.

EDUCATION CODE 42633

The governing board of each school district shall be responsible for filing or causing to be filed with the county superintendent of schools the verified signature of each person, including members of the governing board, authorized to sign orders in its name. Except for districts determined to be fiscally accountable pursuant to Section 42650, no order on the funds of any school district shall be approved by the county superintendent of schools unless the signatures are on file in his office and he is satisfied that the signatures on the order are those of persons authorized to sign the order.

GOVERNMENT CODE 5501

Any authorized officer may, after filing with the Secretary of State his manual signature certified by him under oath, execute or cause to be executed with a facsimile signature in lieu of his manual signature:

- (a) Any public security, provided that at least one signature required or permitted to be placed thereon shall be manually subscribed; and
- (b) Any instrument of payment.

Upon compliance with this section by the authorized officer, his facsimile signature has the same legal effect as his manual signature.

Title: Provisional Internship Permit

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the Provisional Internship Permit for a recommended teaching candidate, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

The Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy, yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since these individuals will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the Provisional Internship Permit information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to candidates on a Provisional Internship Permit are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting Provisional Internship Permit requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicants in the identified positions was made public. The public notice must include the following information: (1) the name of the applicants; (2) the assignment in which the applicants will be employed including subject(s), grade level(s), and school site; and (3) a statement that the applicants will be employed on the basis of a Provisional Internship Permit. Clovis Unified intends to submit Provisional Internship Permit requests for the following teacher candidate(s), contingent upon administration and Board approval:

A Provisional Internship Permit shall be issued for one year and may not be renewed.

The permit request must include a signed statement from the Superintendent, or designee, that the item was acted upon favorably. EXPENSE ACCOUNTS, REIMBURSEMENT & AUTHORIZED EXPENSES

PURPOSE: To establish a policy for the reimbursement of authorized expenses.

A. Field Trips

Education Code 35330 authorizes the District to provide transportation to and from places in the state, any other state, the District of Columbia or a foreign country; however, the District will not receive state transportation allowances for field trips or excursions that have an out-of-state destination. No expenses of students participating in a field trip or excursion to any other state, the District of Columbia, or a foreign country authorized by this section shall be paid with school district funds. These expenses must be paid from student body funds, parent club funds, foundation funds or other sources. Travel for chaperones and District employees traveling with students can be paid with school district funds. (See Board Policy No. 3204)

B. District Travel and Conference

The District recognizes the value and importance of travel and conference attendance for professional improvement, instructional supervision and District business. Pursuant to Education Codes 44032 and 44033, authorized expenses incurred as part of these professional responsibilities shall be reimbursed by the District.

The Superintendent or designee must approve employee and student travel requests to attend meetings, conferences, field trips, athletic events or excursions in accordance with the budget.

In order to reimburse these expenses incurred in carrying out authorized duties, rules and regulations shall be established which outline appropriate expenditures and reimbursement rates. The Superintendent, Associate Superintendent Administrative Services and Assistant Superintendent Business Services are authorized to approve expenses which are in compliance with established expenditure reimbursement guidelines. They may authorize an advance of funds to cover necessary expenses. Upon proper authorization of submitted expenditures, reimbursement shall be made on a timely basis.

Out-of-state travel must have Board approval. Overnight travel for students must have Board approval.

C. District Credit Cards

1. The District's travel designees identified in Exhibit No. 4203 (3) may use a District credit card when making travel arrangements. Other authorized employees may use District credit cards for expenses incurred while attending to District business. Under no circumstances may personal expenses be charged on District credit cards.

D. Mileage Expense Reimbursement

- 1. District personnel and officials who incur mileage expenses in carrying out their authorized duties shall be reimbursed by the District according to the current IRS mileage rate. Mileage reimbursement, as approved by the Board, shall apply when employees use their personal automobile to carry out authorized duties.
- 2. The District administration is authorized to make reasonable adjustments in the monthly mileage allowance when changes in job responsibilities occur; any adjustments will be based on the IRS mileage rate.
- 2.3. Fixed Mileage for federally funded employees will be charged to unrestricted funding sources.

At this time, the District is in critical need of Language Speech Specialists to provide services to students, and collaborate with educators, parents and other professionals to create a safe, healthy and supportive learning environment. Currently, a shortage of Language Speech Specialists exists Nationwide, Statewide, and Districtwide.

Recommended for this position is retired Language Speech Specialist **John Deniston** who served the District for 17 years. Mr. Deniston is a credentialed Language Speech Specialist who provides Language Speech services and assessments to students. Due to growth and the existing shortage, there is a critical need to utilize a qualified retiree to provide these services.
