At the June 12 meeting of the Budget Board Subcommittee, members reviewed a proposed revised Technology Support Specialist job description, a new job description for an Assistant Warehouse Supervisor and a new job description for a Graphic Arts Supervisor; the new job descriptions are due to growth. Members also looked at revised Board Policies No. 2116, 2202, 9301 and 6401 and Administrative Regulation No. 6401, as well as new Board Policy No. 4607 and Administrative Regulation No. 4607, all of which were included in the action and information portions of the June 13, 2018, Board meeting agenda. Members felt confident that Administrative and Business Services staffs were very thorough in their review and determination of funding and budgeting proposals and appreciated that they also accounted for one-time monies which do not carry over and can have a significant impact on the budget.

At their June 12 meeting, CART's Board of Directors received an update on the now-finalized CART Strategic Plan, which has been in development throughout the school year. As part of the Special Presentation on the Plan, a draft version of the Strategic Plan brochure was shared with the Board. Now that the Strategic Plan is in place, CART staff is ready to begin the implementation process for the 2018-19 school year. Next, the CART Board of Directors approved the CART 2018-19 Adopted Budget. Finally, members learned that the Clovis Unified and Fresno Unified facilities, maintenance and finance teams have met and finalized the CART 2018 summer construction projects list, which includes re-roofing and updating the PA and clock systems.

DISCUSSION:

Clovis Unified School District offers Kindergarten and Transitional Kindergarten (TK) in its elementary school programs. The TK program provides students with developmentally appropriate, experimental activities and helps prepare them for the more academically rigorous second year of Kindergarten.

As part of the early primary program, some elementary schools within Clovis Unified offer extended day programs for Kindergarten students as outlined in Board Policy No. 1302. These schools choose to offer extended day Kindergarten programs based on the needs of their student population.

However, according to the law, Kindergarten and Transitional Kindergarten programs must be equal in instructional minutes, unless a waiver of this provision is granted through the California State Board of Education. Requiring TK students to attend school for an extended day based on the minutes of the Kindergarten program would not be in the best educational interest of Clovis Unified's youngest students.

Thus, the District is seeking a waiver that would allow TK programs at selected school sites to operate with instructional minutes that are less than those selected school sites extended Kindergarten programs.

DISCUSSION:

Pursuant to the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Local Education Agencies (LEAs) that apply for ESSA funds are required to complete the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), the LCAP Local Education Agency Plan Addendum (LEAP Addendum), and the Consolidated Application (ConApp). The LCAP, in conjunction with the LEAP and the ConApp, serve to meet the ESSA LEAP requirement. CUSD's LCAP is intended to reflect our annual goals, actions, services and expenditures within a fixed three-year planning cycle. CUSD must include a plan summary for the LCAP each year.

The LCAP and LEAP Addendum communicates and documents Clovis Unified's LCAP actions, services and expenditures to support student outcomes and overall performance. The LCAP is a three-year plan, which is reviewed and updated annually, as required. Charter schools may complete the LCAP to align with the term of the charter school's budget, typically one year, which is submitted to the school's authorizer. The LCAP and Annual Update Template must be completed by all LEAs each year.

Clovis Unified's LCAP describes the District's goals and specific actions to achieve those goals for all students and each student group identified by the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) – ethnic, socioeconomically disadvantaged, English learners, foster youth, pupils with disabilities, and homeless youth – for each of the State priorities and any locally identified priorities.

The proposed services and actions affirmed by attendees at meetings and forums are designed around the following seven focus areas identified by parents, students, employees and community members:

- 1. Parent Involvement and Engagement: Eliminating barriers and training parents to access and support their child's education through increasing CUSD Parent Academies throughout the District and school sites.
- 2. Safety: Maintaining campus environments that allow students to feel secure and focus on their education with the addition of School Resource Officers and extending hours of operation.
- 3. College and Career Readiness: Preparing students for the world after high school to increase their long-term engagement in school and success over time.
- 4. Social and Emotional Well-Being of Students: Provide additional school and district

psychologists who will support students' social and emotional well-being and the District's newly written Comprehensive Wellness Plan.

- 5. Services to Students: At-risk students need more focused attention by caring educators to ensure that they stay in school and succeed academically. Often, families of at-risk students also struggle with accessing the educational environment and need additional assistance and support to do so.
- 6. Intervention Support: One-on-one and targeted intervention is needed for students at risk of not achieving grade level standards.
- 7. Curriculum and Instruction: All students, including at-risk students, are more likely to succeed when instructional materials are sufficient, staff is highly qualified and trained, and instructional strategies and tools are innovative.

DISCUSSION:

California's new accountability dashboard reports the performance of schools based on State standards that were developed for traditional (non-alternative) schools. Recently, the State Board of Education (SBE) and stakeholders raised concerns that the State indicators and standards did not fairly evaluate the success or progress of alternative schools that serve high-risk students. As a result, the California Department of Education (CDE) developed modified methods of measurement for accountability indicators, where appropriate, for alternative schools. This modified method is part of the Dashboard Alternative School Status (DASS) program.

To be eligible for the DASS program, at least 70% of each school's enrollment must be comprised of high-risk student groups. Administrative team members from Clovis Online School, Enterprise High School and the District Office determined that the enrollment for each school exceeds the 70% threshold for high-risk student groups and that DASS would provide the best model to evaluate the performance at both sites. Gateway High School and Clovis Community Day School were automatically placed in the DASS program and, accordingly, those sites are not under consideration here.

Administration was just made aware that the Governing Board must certify the school's enrollment and approve the change to the DASS program and that these approvals must be submitted to the State as part of the application no later than August 15, 2018. Therefore, in order to effectively meet the State's deadline, this agenda item is being submitted to the Board directly for Action, with administration recommending that the Board certify the 70% enrollment of high-risk students at Clovis Online and Enterprise High School, approve the change to the DASS program at these sites, and authorize administration to take whatever additional steps are necessary to carry out these objectives.

DISCUSSION:

Aim I for the District's Strategic Plan is to "Maximize Achievement for ALL students." One way to do this for Clovis Unified students is through effective professional development for teachers.

The Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability Department is recommending that Clovis Unified implement Professor and Education Researcher John Hattie's Visible Learning Plus program, which is provided by Corwin, a SAGE Company. Hattie's research, centered on classroom instruction, has led to a framework that allows school teams to determine the instructional needs of their students. Hattie's Visible Learning Plus is an in-depth coaching model designed for school teams to systematically examine effective instructional practices in order to determine impact on student achievement and learning. By considering the effects of the practices of teachers and leaders, schools will be able to make substantial gains in student achievement.

Visible Learning consultants have designed a customized program of implementation and coaching through which professional development will focus on administrator and teacher coaching to impact student achievement at 14 schools. Approximately 250 teachers will be trained and coached using the consultant and District facilitators.

DISCUSSION:

The Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since these individuals will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the Provisional Internship Permit information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to candidates on a Provisional Internship Permit are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting Provisional Internship Permit requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicants in the identified positions was made public. The public notice must include the following information: (1) the name of the applicant(s); (2) the assignment in which the applicant(s) will be employed including subject(s), grade level(s), and school site; and (3) a statement that the applicant(s) will be employed on the basis of a Provisional Internship Permit. Clovis Unified intends to submit a Provisional Internship Permit request for the following teacher candidates, contingent upon administration and Board approval:

- PURPOSE: To establish rules governing payment of certificated salaries for certificated personnel other than full-time Administrators.
- NOTE: As of July 1, 1997 teaching experience credit is STEP and qualifying units is RANGE.

The Certificated Salary Schedule is based upon the following: (1) academic, professional and practical preparation; (2) teaching experience; and (3) professional growth while in service with the Clovis Unified School District.

A. General Provisions

All probationary and permanent teachers shall be paid in twelve equal payments. Payments shall normally be made on the last banking day of each calendar month.

All requests for reevaluation of issues relating to salary contractual agreements shall be submitted in writing to the Associate Superintendent-Human Resources who shall convene the subcommittee of the Faculty Senate when questions requiring interpretation are involved. Any further appeal from the recommendation of the evaluation shall then be submitted to the Superintendent or designee.

A permanent certificated employee called into the military service, either by selective service or through a call-up of reservists during periods of national emergency, shall receive credit for one step on the salary schedule for each year of military service, in accordance with law. The employee must return to a position requiring certification in the District no later than the start of the next regular term after release from the military establishment.

Errors in salary schedule placement for certificated employees will be reported immediately to the Associate Superintendent-Human Resources or designee.

If an employee does not notify the Associate Superintendent-Human Resources or designee of such an error by September 1 of each fiscal year, no change will be made in the salary status during that year. In the case of contracts issued on or after August 20, the employee must, within ten days, notify the Associate Superintendent-Human Resources or designee of errors, or the employee's pay status shall remain unchanged for the year.

B. Longevity

1. 20 and 25Years (Years of combined teaching experience)

Effective July 1, 2013 Aa longevity step of 20 or 25 years shall be awarded for combined credentialed experience inside and outside Clovis Unified. commencing with the 20th year and 25th year and thereafter for eligible employees.

CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Upon retirement from the District, an individual shall no longer be eligible to receive a longevity increment.

C. Substitutes and Replacements

A salary schedule shall be adopted for substitutes hired to replace certificated personnel. The substitute salary schedule shall be reviewed annually by the Board.

Any substitute will be declared a long-term substitute upon the completion of ten (10) consecutive teaching days in the same position for which a regular teacher is contracted. Beginning with the eleventh (11) consecutive day in the same teaching assignment, the long-term substitute shall be placed on a separate salary schedule which will provide compensation above that of the regular substitute's daily wage.

A substitute teacher hired to replace a regularly employed teacher who it is known will be out for more than ten (10) consecutive days may be classified a long-term substitute from the first day of employment, unless contractual service is agreed upon.

Any substitute hired to replace a regularly employed teacher who is on intermittent medical or sick leave may be classified as a long-term substitute from the first day of service, unless contractual service is agreed upon.

In accordance with the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing, any substitute serving in a long-term position in the same classroom for the same teacher more than 30 days in a school year must hold an appropriate credential authorizing the substitute to teach in the subject area being assigned.

If the long-term substitute holds a 30 day Substitute Permit, this will only authorize the holder to serve as a day-to-day substitute teacher. The holder may not serve as a substitute for more than 30 working days for any <u>one</u> teacher during the school year, except in a special education classroom, where the holder may serve no more than 20 working days for any <u>one</u> teacher during the school year. When the 30 working days have been exceeded (30 working days total, not consecutive) the substitute must then be appropriately credentialed in the assigned subject area.

Substitute teachers will be paid on the last working day of each calendar month.

DISCUSSION:

The District created the California School Funding Coalition (CSFC) in April 2013. The CSFC and SSC work together to ensure every public school in California receives the funding necessary to provide a high-quality education for all students. Consultants provide support with Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) implementation issues, in addition to coordination and recruitment of members in the Coalition and Legislative and advocacy services. Currently, there are 48 school districts participating in the CSFC.

The current agreement with SSC expires June 30, 2018, and in order for the Coalition to continue to utilize these services, it will be necessary for the Board to renew the existing agreement.

This agreement is for one year beginning July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

The annual cost of this agreement is approximately \$75,000, plus expenses. The contract amount is dependent upon the number of participating districts in the Coalition. The cost is included in the CSFC 2018-19 budget.

DISCUSSION:

In March 2016, Fresno Unified School District advertised for bids for the purchase of musical instruments. All provisions of the Public Contract Code were followed by Fresno Unified awarding a bid for the purchase of said items.

Fresno Unified awarded a piggyback contract for the purchase of musical instruments through American Music Co., Gottschalk Music Center, Harvard House Music, Horn Shop and Midwest Musical Imports. The contract is valid through June 2019. Orders will only be placed against this bid as long as it remains in the best interest of the District to do so.

Approval of this piggyback purchase would allow for the expedited purchase of new musical instruments for District VAPA programs. The piggyback allows for the purchase of new instruments which meet all District standards. This would allow Clovis Unified to receive negotiated cost savings and save order lead time. It is recommended that the Board authorize the purchase of musical instruments through the piggyback process.

DISCUSSION:

The District has the opportunity to refinance for interest rate savings and tax restructuring purposes some of its outstanding general obligation bonds, previously issued pursuant to 2004 and 2012 voter-approved bond measures. The refinancing is expected to require a tax levy on the 2018-19 tax rolls because capital appreciation bonds will be replaced by current interest bonds. The county is expected to set tax rates for fiscal year 2018-19 before refinancing is accomplished. As such, it is necessary for the District to adopt a resolution requesting the county to include an estimate of the tax rate needed to provide payment of the District's 2018 refunding bonds, which are not yet issued, but are expected to be issued in fiscal year 2018-19. The tax rate to be set will maintain the commitment to our community of a tax of \$153.35 per \$100,000 assessed value.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING DEBT SERVICE ESTIMATE TO BE PROVIDED TO THE COUNTY OF FRESNO RESPECTING UNSOLD GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-19

WHEREAS, bond elections have been duly and regularly held in the Clovis Unified School District (the "District"), including on March 2, 2004, and on June 5, 2012, under the procedures specified in Proposition 39 (Article XIII A Section 1 paragraph (b) of the California Constitution) for the purpose of submitting bond measures both known as "Measure A" (together, the "Bond Measures") to the qualified electors of the District authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds (the "Bonds"), and more than 55% of the votes cast at said elections were in favor of the issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board has issued Bonds pursuant to the Bond Measures in multiple series, including its General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2004, Series A dated December 15, 2004, in the aggregate original principal amount of \$119,998,286.10 (the "Series 2004A Bonds) and its General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2012, Series C dated September 3, 2014, in the aggregate original principal amount of \$64,995,504.55 (the "Series 2012C Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the District expects that it will authorize the issuance of refunding bonds (the "2018 Bonds") to refinance for savings certain outstanding maturities of the Series 2004A Bonds and the Series 2012C Bonds, including certain maturities that were issued as capital appreciation bonds, and as a result of the refinancing will require a tax to be placed on the 2018-19 tax roll to provide for amortization of the 2018 Bonds in fiscal year 2018-19; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 15252 of the California Education Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fresno (the "County") is required to levy a tax for payment of bonds which have been authorized but not yet issued, provided that the Governing Board of the District informs the County of its intention to issue such bonds prior to the next tax levy; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board wishes at this time to authorize District staff to make certain communications with the County respecting the foregoing.

THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Governing Board hereby finds, determines, declares and resolves as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The Governing Board hereby finds and determines that the foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Intention to Issue Refunding Bonds. The Governing Board hereby expresses its current expectation that it will cause the issuance of approximately \$10 million aggregate principal amount of 2018 Bonds during Fiscal Year 2018-19. The 2018 Bonds are currently expected to be issued in fiscal year 2018-19 after the time that the tax rates are set by the County, to refinance certain maturities of the Series 2004A Bonds and the Series 2012C Bonds. Although the District has previously provided a debt service schedule to the County with respect to the Series 2004A Bonds and the Series 2012C Bonds, due primarily to the refinancing of capital appreciation bonds and replacing them with bonds which bear current interest, it is expected that the refinancing will require an additional tax on the 2018-19 tax roll.

Section 3. Information to County. The Superintendent, the Deputy Superintendent, the Associate Superintendent, Administrative Services, or the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services of the District are hereby authorized to (a) file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, and (b) provide, or cause to be provided, an estimate of debt service for the 2018 Bonds to the Auditor-Controller of the County at the earliest possible date following the adoption of this Resolution.

Section 4. Request to County to Levy Tax. The Board of Supervisors of the County is hereby requested, in accordance with Section 15252-15254, to adopt a tax rate which takes into account the 2018 Bonds expected to be sold during Fiscal Year 2018-19, based upon estimated debt service schedules prepared by officers of the District or the District's consultants, and to levy a tax in Fiscal Year 2018-19 on all taxable property in the District sufficient to pay said estimated debt service. The proceeds of such tax shall be deposited into the debt service fund of the District established pursuant to the Education Code for bonds of the District.

Section. 5. Application of Tax Proceeds. In the event that the 2018 Bonds of the District are not sold during Fiscal Year 2018-19, or sold in such amount and on such terms that the proceeds of the tax requested in Section 4 hereof, or any portion thereof, is not required for payment of debt service due on the 2018 Bonds, or the Series 2004A Bonds or the Series 2012C Bonds, or payment of other outstanding bonds of the District payable from debt service funds of the District, this Board hereby requests that the Auditor-Controller, or other appropriate official of the County, cause the remaining proceeds of the respective tax to be held in the District's debt service fund and applied to debt service on outstanding general obligation bonds of the District coming due in fiscal year 2019-20.

Section 6. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to transfer ownership of said Easement Area to PG&E in that PG&E will construct and maintain the public utilities improvements; and



The revised plan was reviewed and developed by a team comprised of individuals from across Clovis Unified representing various departments, District-level parent committees and site representatives who possess an expertise in the area of English Learners. Throughout the 2018-19 school year, the document will be presented to and reviewed by the District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC), School Site Councils (SSC) and English Language Advisory Committees (ELAC). All sites will receive additional training in the fall of 2018. Schools then present and review the document at their quarterly ELAC and SSC meetings. The revised document will be presented and reviewed with the DELAC and the District Advisory Committee (DAC) in fall 2018.

The revised CUSD Master Plan – A Guide to Services for English Learners incorporates District and State program revisions including new Title III requirements and revisions implemented by the California Department of Education adopted by the State Board of Education including, but not limited to, the following:

Ratify a Memorandum of Understanding with the California Teaching Fellows Foundation (CTFF) effective August 1, 2018, through June 28, 2019, in order to provide additional instructional assistants and direct support to all students who qualify for Clovis Unified's After School Education and Safety (ASES) Program.

DISCUSSION:

California Teaching Fellows Foundation (CTFF) employs undergraduates enrolled in a community college or university. CTFF reaches undergraduates in fields beyond teacher preparation to include kinesiology, science, engineering, business, art, music, drama, recreation and more. Teaching Fellows tutors reinforce their own learning by teaching in their chosen field, while K-12 students gain from engaging teaching methods. In Clovis Unified, CTFF students staff the ASES Programs at 11 of Clovis Unified's 12 Title I elementary schools where the program is offered.

The ASES Program is an extension of the regular school day in partnership with community agencies to provide afterschool education and enrichment. Student and parent surveys indicate that participation in the ASES Program increases student achievement and improves academics, attendance, and a sense of school pride.

Teaching Fellows are supervised by credentialed site certificated leads and receive ongoing professional development. The Teaching Fellows bring energetic, trained staff members to help students after the regular school day and in turn receive hands-on experiences in preparation for a career in education. The use of CTFF Teaching Fellows participants was first approved by the CUSD Governing Board in March 2007.

School contracts with CTFF are based on the number of Teaching Fellows and their projected work hours. The following is the distribution of resources by each school:
