The Clovis Unified Employee Health Center by miCare formally opened its doors on Friday, February 16, 2018, and is now in its fourth year of operation. An outcome of the District's Employee Benefits Committee, the health center is designed to eliminate barriers to healthcare and wellness for benefitted employees and their dependents, and to assist in controlling costs of the District's self-insured health plan. Since its opening, the miCare team has treated well over 60,000 patients, either in person or through its telehealth system, contributing to increased wellness and productivity of the CUSD team. Clovis Unified School District (CUSD) After School Education & Safety (ASES) Program Information

The CUSD ASES program provides a complementary learning system, intentionally integrating out of school time with the instructional day to ensure success for all students. The after school program consists of three components: academic and literacy support, healthy fitness and well-being, and recreational and educational enrichments. The program commences immediately upon the conclusion of the regular school day and operates a minimum of 15 hours per week and at least until 6:00 p.m. The ASES Program is an extension of the regular school day continuing to provide a safe environment both physically and emotionally, which supports building positive relationships and is of no cost to participating families. Students in the program receive a nutritious snack provided by CUSD Campus Catering. Attendance is an essential component to the program and its funding.

Once every three years CUSD submits a grant application to receive ASES funding called “ASES Renewal Grant Application”. The application requires a completion of two parts to be submitted together.

Part I: The Program Plan

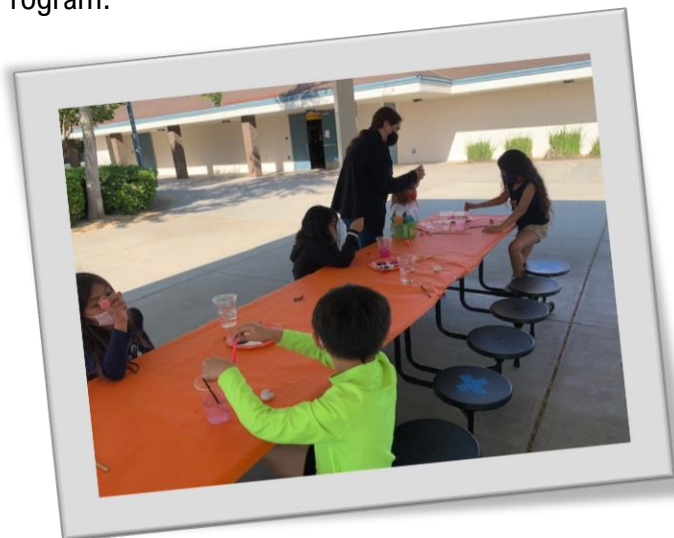
This contains program data, demographic information, and CUSD's plans on the program implementation, and is submitted in November.

Part II: The Grant Renewal Application

This contains budget information, additional program data, and signatures, and is submitted in January.

The funds are designed to provide a safe after school environment including classroom instruction, intervention activities, and enrichment opportunities to reinforce academics for students. The ASES Renewal Grant Application was last reviewed, completed, and submitted in December 2019 to the California Department of Education Expanded Learning Division (CDE-EXLD). In April 2020, CUSD ASES Renewal Grant Application was reviewed and approved by CDE-EXLD for another three years. This year, 2020-2021, is the first year of the new grant cycle.

The ASES program is discussed as an agenda item during parent advisory committee meetings, including English Learners Advisory Committee (ELAC), School Site Council (SSC), School Advisory Committee (SAC), District Migrant Education Parent Advisory Committee (DMEPAC), Indian Education Program Parent Advisory Committee (IPAC), District Advisory Council (DAC) and District English Learners Advisory Committee (DELAC). One of the roles of the ASES Program Supervisor is to support schools in the implementation of ASES Program.

Although ASES programs operated differently this school year due to the pandemic, all 14 Title I elementary schools with an ASES program still provided support and services to their learning community. Seven elementary schools received Proposition 49 ASES Grants from the California Department of Education (CDE), five elementary schools received funding through the District Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), and two elementary schools received Proposition 49 ASES Grant funding under the jurisdiction of Fresno County Superintendent of Schools (FCSS). Funding for the ASES Grant is based on the percentage of Free and Reduced Price Meal (FRPM).

ASES Evaluation Report Format

Each spring students, parents, staff, and community partners participate in the annual ASES survey to evaluate the effectiveness of the ASES programs as well as plan for the following year. Since ASES is funded through the state, California Department of Education (CDE), and Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), it requires an annual evaluation and program monitoring.

In the fall, each ASES school site receives a completed Annual Evaluation Report to share with stakeholders. The evaluation process provides the site with an opportunity to review and reflect on their program from an internal point of view, collaborating with all stakeholders. The ASES survey provides valuable information from all stakeholders on critical issues concerning the ASES program. The annual evaluation addresses quality indicators of an effective ASES program. These include, but are not limited to: participation rate, expenditures, staff development opportunities, parent participation, student achievement, and recommendations for continued improvement. Based upon a comprehensive analysis of data, schools are asked to articulate effective components as well as any program modifications. Schools are committed to promoting excellence and high expectations for all students, striving to ensure the use of meaningful survey data in decision-making. The evaluation report is shared with all stakeholders.

Quality Standards for Expanded Learning in California

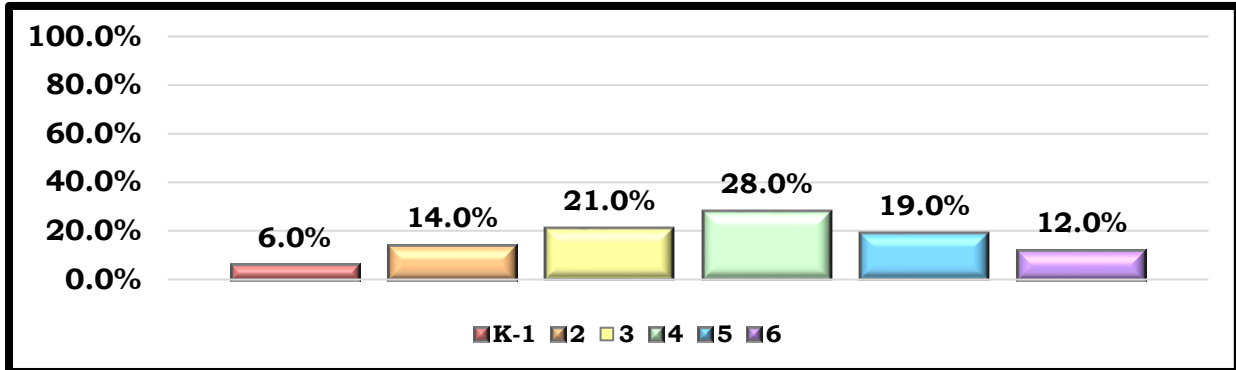
CUSD has adopted the twelve “Quality Standards for Expanded Learning in California”. The Quality Standards for Expanded Learning are designed to assist expanded learning programs, such as ASES, in providing an effective and quality after school program. These quality standards provide a common framework of clear expectations and a guide for all stakeholders across California. The twelve quality standards are broken down into two categories: Point-of-Service and Programmatic. Each quality standard has three levels of action: Programmatic, Staff, and Participant. Listed below are the Quality Standards for Expanded Learning in California.

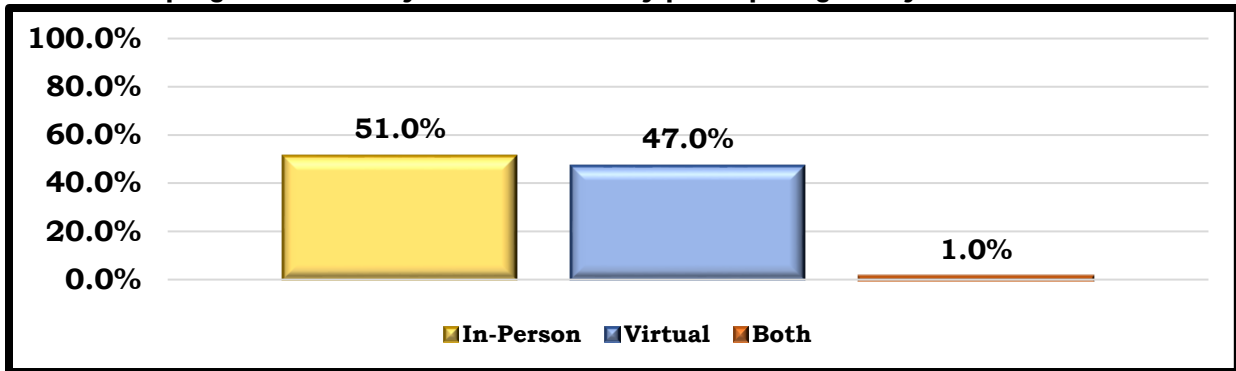
After School Education and Safety (ASES) Program Annual Parent Survey 2020-21 Results



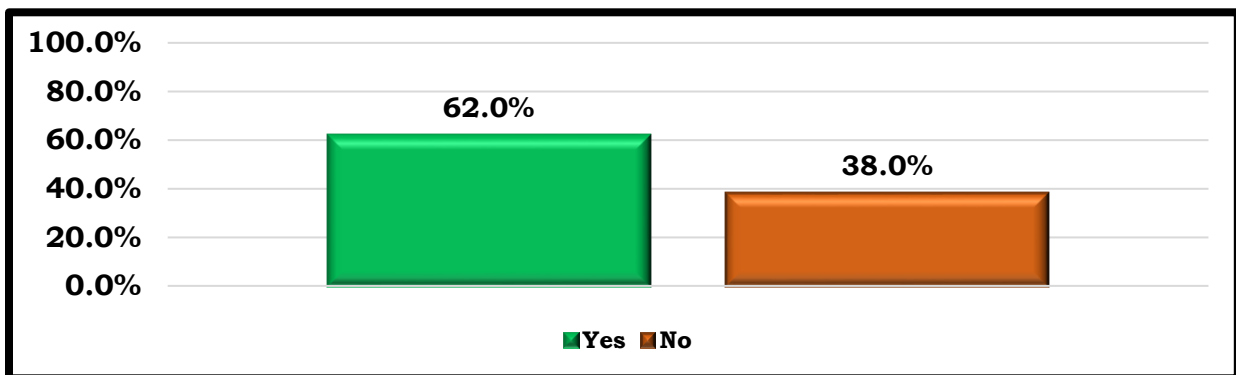
1. What is your child's present grade level?



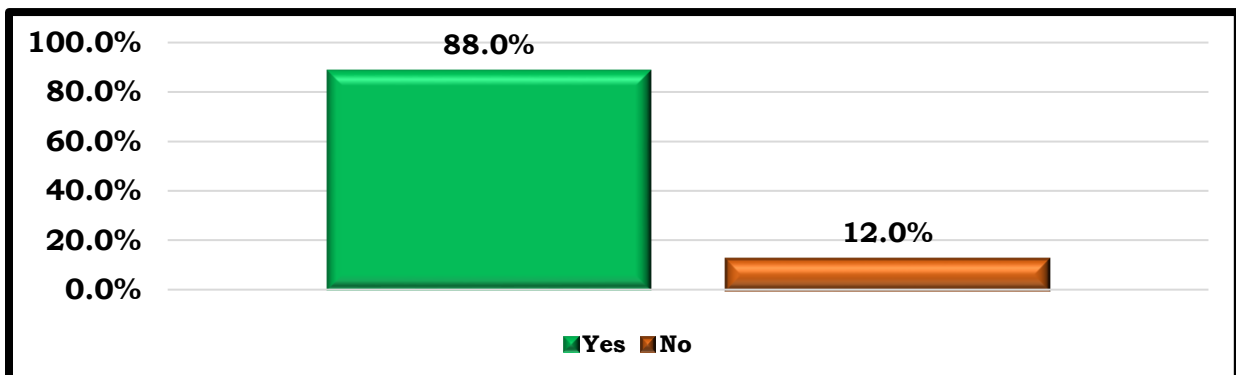
2. Which ASES program model is your child currently participating in at your child's school?



3. Did your child participate in virtual program at any point this school year?



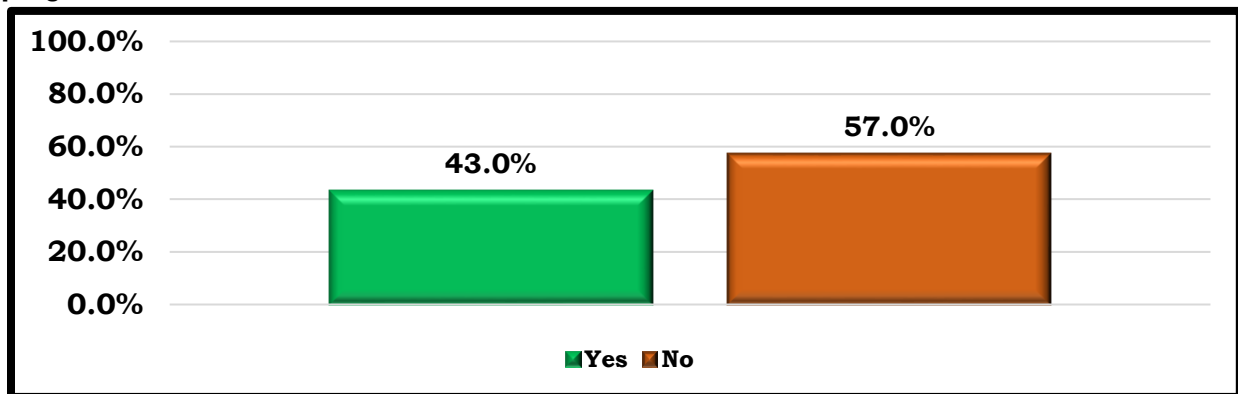

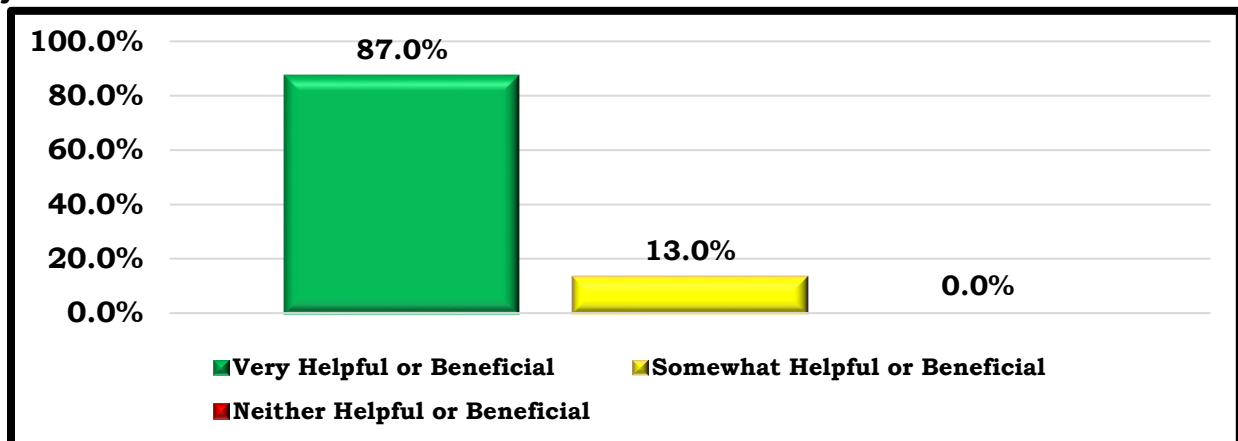
5. Please describe your experience and let us know how we can improve on our virtual program.

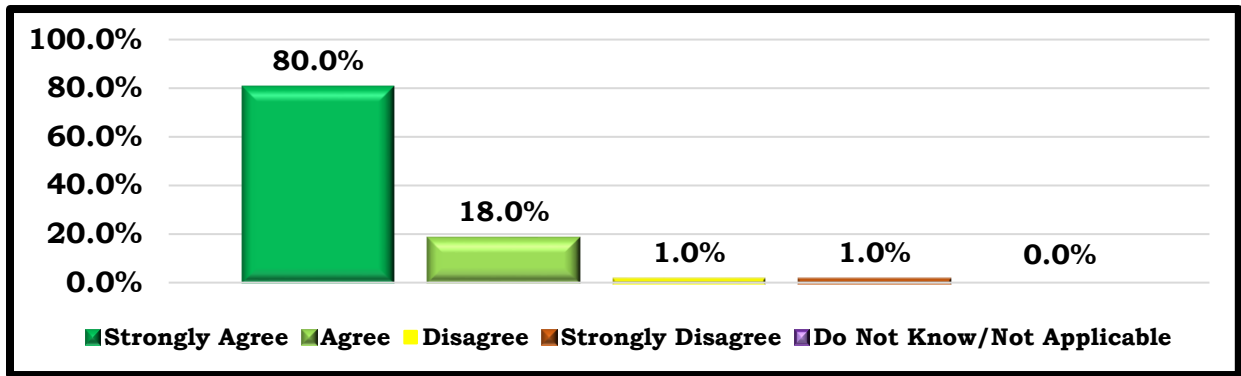

OUR MISSION

The mission of Clovis Unified Preschool is to provide an exemplary, developmentally appropriate well-rounded educational opportunity for every child.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

❖ Program Description

Clovis Unified Preschool is a high quality, developmentally appropriate program for three and four-year-old children. The program strives to offer a quality curriculum that recognizes and values each child's potential and fulfills the California Preschool Learning Foundations. California State Preschool Programs (CSPP) are available at no cost to eligible families. For those families that are not eligible, two private pay programs are offered. All programs are three hours per day and available in morning or afternoon sessions.

❖ Background Information

Created in the spring of 1993, Clovis Unified Preschool opened six programs at six elementary school sites, with fifteen employees and ninety students. The program has expanded to forty-eight programs at twenty-nine school sites, one hundred thirty-five employees and over nine hundred fifty students. Preschool currently offers eight Inclusion Programs and six Language Experience Programs in partnership with Clovis Unified's Special Education Department, serving over one hundred students with disabilities.

Clovis Unified Preschool is required to follow all Title 22 requirements which include annual inspections of our facilities by the Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing Division. The programs are also required to adhere to Title 5 requirements, which include annual Program Self-Evaluations and Federal Program Monitoring every three to five years.

PROGRAM SELF-EVALUATION PROCESS

The California Department of Education (CDE) under Title 5, requires CSPP contractors to complete a Program Self-Evaluation (PSE) annually. The Program Self-Evaluation consists of four components:

- Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP)
- Desired Results Parent Survey
- Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale (ECERS-R)
- Program Review Instrument

As part of the continuous improvement cycle, contractors are required to analyze findings from the self-evaluation and develop both a written list of tasks to modify the program and create procedures for ongoing monitoring to assure that areas that are satisfactory continue to meet standards. Contractors are required to submit a Summary of Findings of the Program Self-Evaluation (PSE) to the California Department of Education (CDE) by June 1st of every year. The procedure for the PSE has been modified this year due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Contractors are only required to complete plans for DRDP and Parent Surveys and submit the information in an online survey format. The PSE is shared with all stakeholders including parents and families, site staff, Child Development administration, and the Governing Board.



DESIRED RESULTS DEVELOPMENTAL PROFILE

The Desired Results Developmental Profile is an individual assessment that preschool teachers complete twice a year to measure student progress on a continuum from Preschool to Kindergarten entry. These results are summarized and shared with parents. Preschool teachers use the formative data to plan for instruction—just as K-12 teachers do when they assess children. Preschool teachers analyze the data, plan for individual and group instruction and continually monitor progress. Teachers complete a Summary of Findings with possible areas for improvement. District-wide program data is analyzed for trends. This data drives the program’s continuous improvement cycle. The summary is used to create the annual Program Self-Evaluation.

DESIRED RESULTS PARENT SURVEY

Desired Results Parent Surveys are distributed each spring in an online survey format. Families are asked 37 questions regarding how the program helps parents support their child’s learning and development and meets the family’s needs. Survey results are analyzed by individual classroom staff and program administrators. The survey data is included in the Program Self-Evaluation.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ENVIRONMENT RATING SCALE

The Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale (ECERS-R) is designed to assess quality in an early childhood program. The rating scale views child development from a comprehensive, or global, point of view, examining a wide variety of areas that all contribute to positive development. The areas include:

Space and Furnishings
Personal Care Routines
Language-Reasoning
Activities

Interaction
Program Structure
Parents and Staff

Preschool staff work together to complete the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale in their classroom. A Summary of Findings is completed with possible areas for improvement. All classroom Summary of Findings are analyzed by the Preschool Administration and one agency wide Summary of Findings is completed as a part of the Program Self-Evaluation.

PROGRAM REVIEW INSTRUMENT

The Program Review Instrument consists of six overall areas and twenty specific requirements. The areas include:

Involvement

Governance and Administration

Standards, Assessment, and Accountability

Staffing and Professional Development

Opportunity and Equal Educational Access and Teaching and Learning

FuelEd will reclaim durable Materials by informing the Customer and/or its students which Materials need to be returned and provide pre-paid return shipping labels. FuelEd Materials are intended solely for the use of the teachers and the students enrolled in FuelEd courses to whom FuelEd provides the Materials. Customer shall not transfer or resell the Materials to any other person. If a replacement component is required or a durable material is not returned, the Customer will be invoiced for the component or Materials (plus shipping, if applicable). Customers will provide FuelEd with reasonable assistance in obtaining durable Materials from students and their parents.

5. Description of Services.

Hosting Solution: The set-up, configuration and hosting of the applicable courseware for the delivery of courses, solely for the provision of educational services to its students in the Territory enrolled in Customers educational programs.

6. Billing Terms.

Customer shall be invoiced for the Educational Products and Services ordered hereunder in accordance with the Terms unless otherwise specified on this Order. Customer shall be invoiced monthly and all invoices shall be payable Net 30 days from Customer's receipt of invoice.

Services Billing Terms: Services shall be invoiced upon order. No refunds except as otherwise noted.

K12 K-12 Student License: Customer will be invoiced for the ordered number of K12 K-12 Student Licenses within 30 days of the signature of this Order. No other refunds, credits or cancellations are allowed. Standard payment terms are Net 30 days.

K12 Materials: FuelEd will invoice the customer upon shipment. Materials costs are refunded 100% if the student is withdrawn within 10 days of order placement, or 50% if the student is withdrawn between the 11th and 30th day. There is no refund or credit on materials for withdrawals occurring after 30 days.

ATTACHMENT A

ONLINE EDUCATIONAL PRODUCTS AND SERVICES ORDER CALIFORNIA STUDENT DATA RIDER

This Attachment is fully incorporated into the terms and conditions of the Online Educational Products and Services Order ("Order") to which it is attached and the FuelEd Online Educational Products and Services Agreement Terms (the "Terms") that are incorporated into said Order. It modifies or adds certain provisions found in the Order and Terms, as noted below.

WHEREAS, the Customer is a California public entity subject to all state and federal laws governing education, including but not limited to California Assembly Bill 1584 ("AB 1584"), and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA");

WHEREAS, AB 1584 requires, in part, that any agreement entered into, renewed or amended after January 1, 2015 between a local education agency and a third-party service provider must include certain terms; and

WHEREAS, the Customer and the FuelEd desire to have the Online Educational Products and Services Agreement provided comply with AB 1584 and FERPA.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The term of this Attachment shall expire on the termination date stated in the Order or Terms, whichever controls.
2. Pupil Records obtained by FuelEd from Customer continue to be the property of and under the Control of the Customer. "Pupil Records" shall be defined as any information directly related to a pupil that is maintained by the Customer or acquired directly from the pupil through the use of instructional software or applications assigned to the pupil by a teacher or other Customer employees. Pupil Records does not include information that cannot be used to identify an individual pupil ("De-Identified Information") used by FuelEd to (i) improve educational products for adaptive learning purposes and for customized pupil learning; (ii) demonstrate the effectiveness of FuelEd's products in the marketing of those products; or, (iii) for the development and improvement of educational sites, services, or applications. "Control" shall be defined as the right of Customer to direct FuelEd to (i) use Pupil Records in FuelEd's performance of the services purchased under the Order and Terms; (ii) destroy some or all Pupil Records in a commercially reasonable time; or, (iii) return some or all Pupil Records in a mutually agreed upon media format in a commercially reasonable time.
3. The procedures by which pupils may retain Control of their own Pupil-Generated Content are outlined as follows: Pupils may exercise possession or Control directly through the learning management system in which the Pupil-Generated Content resides, or provide a specific request to Customer. Customer will then forward the request to FuelEd, which will take commercially reasonable steps to comply. These steps will be limited to the following actions: (1) deleting the Pupil-Generated Content if not otherwise prohibited by the Terms or applicable law, and (2) providing Customer with a copy of the requested Pupil-Generated Content in a mutually agreed upon media format in a commercially reasonable time. "Pupil-Generated Content" shall be defined as materials created by a pupil, including, but not limited to, essays, research reports, portfolios, creative writing, music or other audio files, photographs, and account information that enables ongoing ownership of pupil content. Pupil-Generated Content does not include pupil responses to a standardized assessment where pupil possession and control would jeopardize the validity and reliability of that assessment.
4. Parents, legal guardians, or eligible pupils may review Pupil Records and correct erroneous information by the following protocol: Requestors eligible to review and correct such documents under applicable law shall submit such requests to Customer. If such data is available to Customer through its account administration on a FuelEd learning management system, Customer shall respond to the request directly. If the requested information is not available to Customer, Customer shall then forward valid requests to FuelEd. FuelEd will respond by providing the Pupil Record to Customer in a mutually agreed upon media format or make corrections to a Pupil Record, both in a commercially reasonable time.
5. FuelEd shall take actions to ensure the security and confidentiality of Pupil Records, including but not limited to designating and training responsible individuals on ensuring the security and confidentiality of Pupil Records, by the following measures: Operate its systems infrastructure at the moderate level baseline as defined in the National Institute of Standards and Technology ("NIST") 800-53 Rev. 3 moderate baseline requirements, and/or in accordance with industry accepted cyber-security standards. Through the aforementioned actions and other industry accepted means, FuelEd shall ensure compliance with FERPA.
6. In the event of an unauthorized disclosure of a Pupil Record, FuelEd shall report to an affected parent, legal guardian, or eligible pupil pursuant to the following procedure: Upon internal confirmation of an unauthorized disclosure of a Pupil Record belonging to a pupil served by Customer, FuelEd shall contact Customer with information related to the disclosure. Customer will then contact the affected parties and inform them of the unauthorized disclosure.
7. FuelEd shall not use any information in a Pupil Record for any purpose other than those required to perform its obligations under the Online Educational Products and Services Agreement, or as otherwise allowed by applicable law.
8. FuelEd certifies that Pupil Records shall not be retained or available to FuelEd upon termination of the Online Educational Products and Services Agreement. In order to comply with this section, upon termination of the Online Educational Products and Services Agreement, Customer shall instruct FuelEd in writing that it does not wish to receive further products or services and that FuelEd should destroy or return Pupil Records. After deleting remaining Pupil Records, FuelEd shall confirm in writing to Customer that such deletion is completed.

DISCUSSION:

Clovis Unified's Career Technical Education Department has contracted with GrowthPoint Technologies for the past three years to implement the summer enrichment program to provide CTE exposure to students grades 7-11. In continuing the partnership, the program below is funded through the CTE Strong Workforce Program.

Program Description: ***Dive into STEM*** is a five-day camp, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. daily, that incorporates a STEM-themed curriculum and provides STEM engagement via:

- **Crew Challenges** – Critical thinking, creativity, communication, and collaboration are required and demonstrated as students work in crews to complete tasks in applied sciences.
- **Scuba Diving** (pool diving with scuba gear) – Students learn the basics of scuba and are equipped with required scuba gear and tanks to carry out crew challenges in neutral buoyancy conditions. Students complete Level 1 diving certification in the five-day camp.
- **Engineering Solutions** – Students design, build, test, and re-design unmanned underwater robots. (Drone flight and technology may serve as a replacement, based on student demand).
- **Team Building** – Students engage in team-building activities to learn and internalize leadership principles.
- **Problem-Based Learning** – Student crews are engaged in problem-based learning through challenges in the Scuba Challenge, Team Building, and Engineering Design and as they prepare for team competitions on the last day of camp.

Staffing includes a camp director, two certified scuba instructors, instructors for underwater robotics, and two instructional assistants.

Camp Clothing includes shorts, rash guard, and t-shirt issued to each camper.

Career Information is provided daily through interview/discussions with STEM professionals during lunch time. Guests provide a career perspective for selecting STEM subjects in high school and college.

Service agreement in the amount of \$39,200, which is to be paid using CTE Strong Workforce Program funding.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve an annual agreement with School Services of California (SSC) for legislative consulting and advocacy.

DISCUSSION:

The District created the California School Funding Coalition (CSFC) in April 2013. The CSFC and SSC work together to ensure every public school in California receives the funding necessary to provide a high-quality education for all students. Consultants provide support with Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) implementation issues, in addition to coordination and recruitment of members in the Coalition and Legislative and advocacy services. Currently, there are 56 school districts participating in the CSFC.

The current agreement with SSC expired June 30, 2021, and, in order for the Coalition to continue to utilize these services, it will be necessary for the Board to renew the existing agreement.

This agreement is for one year beginning July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

The annual cost of this agreement is approximately \$75,000, plus expenses. The contract amount is dependent upon the number of participating districts in the Coalition. The cost is included in the CSFC 2021-22 budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the reduction of total program hours for the Clovis Adult Education's Nurse Assistant program from 285 to 214.

DISCUSSION:

There will be no change to the 60 hours of theory for the Nurse Assistant program. Seventy-one clinical skills hours are requested to be eliminated based on the recommendation of the Clovis Adult Allied Health Occupational Advisory Committee. Currently, Clovis Adult Education requires 225 clinical hours, which exceeds the requirements for State certification by 125 hours. Decreasing the required hours of the program will allow Clovis Adult Education to compete with other public and private institutions. Additional practice lab hours were added 15 years ago to enhance clinical skills attainment. During the 2020-2021 school year, student learning and testing were tracked and data analyzed. This study indicated zero adverse effects on student learning and the State Board pass rate by reducing clinical skill hours. There are no substantive content changes that would affect vocational skills attainment and job placement with the reduction in clinical skills hours.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

With this change, an increase in revenue is anticipated by increasing enrollment and adding a 2022 summer Nurse Assistant program session. Decreasing the total hours of Nurse Assistant program will not decrease the amount of the course fee. Reducing the clinical hours will help potential students seeking vocational training by shortening the program's overall length, attracting students seeking short-term training, and place graduates more rapidly into employment.

Mr. Dwight Pullen:

Upon the recommendation of the Clovis Adult Education Nursing Occupational Advisory Committee, the Nurse Assistant program hours have been decreased. Following the Advisory Committees' guidance, the Nurse Assistant program has reduced its hours to become more marketable and competitive with similar programs in the area. Additional practice hours for students were added previously for clinical skills training. Tracking and testing for student learning indicated no effect on the State Board pass rate by reducing the clinical skill hours. Furthermore, there are no substantive content changes that would negatively affect vocational skills attainment and job placement with the decrease in hours.

The Governing Board of the Clovis Unified School District and Clovis Unified School District Administration have approved the decrease in hours of the Nurse Assistant Program from 285 to 214 total hours. The Governing Board voted to approve this change at a meeting held on the 21st day of July, 2021.

Approve the Provisional Internship Permit for the recommended teaching candidates, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

The Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since these individuals will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the Provisional Internship Permit information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to candidates on a Provisional Internship Permit are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting Provisional Internship Permit requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicants in the identified positions was made public. DISCUSSION:

Over the last seven months the Business Services team has been evaluating staffing needs and responsibilities. As part of this review, the District consulted with a team from Fiscal Crisis Management Assistance Team (FCMAT) to conduct an in-depth study of the Budget and Finance Department. As a result of this study it is recommended that the District hire an Assistant Director, Budget and Finance. This will be the first step in beginning to reorganize the department based on FCMAT's recommendations. This position reclassifies the current open Manager, Budget and Finance position to one that requires a higher level of experience and management skills. This position will oversee the daily duties of the Budget and Finance Department. Essential duties will include assisting the Director of Budget and Finance, supervising the Budget and Finance team, and directing and controlling workflow in order to provide accurate, timely delivery of high quality services. As a result of the FCMAT review and evaluation of the current open positions in the Budget and Finance Department, this new job description will allow for our immediate ability to post, interview, and bring forward a recommended candidate as the first phase of the department restructure.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE:

Total fiscal impact of the transition from a Budget Finance Manager position to an Assistant Director position is \$13,996; however it is expected that through the entire reorganization of the Budget and Finance Department, there will be cost savings to offset almost all of this additional cost.

Under general direction plans, organizes and supervises the duties of the Budget and Finance Department to ensure accurate and timely financial reports including quarterly SACS reporting. - The appointment has been approved by the governing body of the employer in a public meeting.

The District finds the appointment of retiree, David Behlen, is necessary to fill the critically needed position of School Bus Driver II for the District. Due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic the District has a need for qualified school bus drivers. The employment for the retiree shall be limited to 960 hours per fiscal year.

~~DRESS AND~~ GROOMING

This ~~administrative~~ regulations ~~specifies~~ standards of dress and grooming promoting a safe school setting conducive to a positive learning environment consistent with ~~the Board's p~~Policy No. 5132-governing acceptable and appropriate apparel and appearance for students.

A. Apparel

All clothing shall be neat, clean, and acceptable in repair and appearance and shall be worn within the bounds of decency and good taste as appropriate for school.

1. Articles of clothing which display gang symbols, profanity or products or slogans which promote tobacco, alcohol, drugs or sex; materially interfere with school work; ~~or~~ create disorder or disrupt the educational process are not allowed.
2. Any clothing or apparel that a student or group of students wear to identify themselves for the purpose of harassing, threatening, or intimidating others will not be allowed.
3. Military, paramilitary, or camouflage (military style) clothing will not be permitted.
4. Extreme fashion that draws undue attention to the student will not be allowed. This includes distracting clothing; and distracting make-up, ~~ete~~.
5. Jackets and other apparel depicting professional sports teams shall not be worn. Jackets or other apparel depicting college or university teams are acceptable unless such team designations are associated with gangs or otherwise conflict with the standards for acceptable apparel.
6. Underwear-type sleeveless shirts, athletic tank tops, beach wear, swim wear, halter-tops, tube tops, spaghetti straps, bare midriffs or chests, see-through or fishnet outfits, or off the shoulder and low-cut tops are not appropriate or acceptable. Dresses and skirts are to be worn no shorter than five inches (5") above the top of the kneecap, but no shorter than mid-thigh. Clothing that exposes bare midriffs or cleavages is prohibited. Shoulder straps on tops and other clothing must be a minimum of two inches (2") wide.
7. Shorts are to be worn no shorter than five inches (5") above the top of the kneecap, but no shorter than mid-thigh. Shorts are to be hemmed and not form fitting. Bike shorts (spandex), gym shorts, frayed shorts, or shorts with holes are unacceptable. Athletic shorts with pockets are permissible. Shorts worn during ~~P~~physical ~~E~~ducation may not be worn during regular class time at secondary sites.
8. Straps on shoes and clothing must be fastened at all times.

9. Leggings will be allowed if over-garment is no shorter than five inches (5") above the top of the kneecap, but no shorter than mid-thigh.
10. Shoes must be worn by all students. No hard-toed or steel-toed shoes/boots will be allowed. No high top, laced up, combat, or military style boots will be allowed. Shoes, or sandals without heel straps that do not present a safety concern may be worn by students in grades 7 through 12, except during physical education classes, recess, while participating in school-related athletic competitions, events or activities, or while participating in other activities where safety is a concern. Backless shoes commonly known as "flip-flops," "beach shoes," "soccer sandals," "zories," and/or thongs are inappropriate and will not be allowed. See Exhibit No. 21055132(2).
11. For safety reasons, students in grades pre-school through 6 are not allowed to wear flip-flops, shoes, or sandals without a heel strap. See Exhibit No. 21055132(2).
12. No slippers will be allowed.
13. Excessively baggy pants, including sweatpants, are not allowed. Pants cannot exceed five inches (5") when measured at the kneecap of the straightened leg. Pants must fit and be worn at the natural waist. The bottom of the pant leg may not be frayed or drag on the ground. Pants must be hemmed and not stapled, pinned, or taped.
14. Sleepwear is not permissible.
15. Oversized shirts that present a safety concern or reflect gang style are not acceptable.
16. If hats (including visors) are worn, students are only permitted to wear their specific school or high school area related hats. All hats must be worn facing forward at all times. All other hats are unacceptable. Hats and/or caps and/or sunglasses must be removed in the classrooms or offices. Specific clothing and hats determined by the school district or school site to be gang-related or inappropriate apparel are not acceptable. Articles of sun-protective clothing, including, but not limited to, hats and sunglasses, may be used outdoors. Subject to these provisions, sun-protective clothing, headwear, other than caps or hats, will not be allowed at school. School sites may add other restrictions on the type of hats to be worn.
17. No frayed or torn clothing is acceptable (manufactured or otherwise).
18. Clothing, jewelry, and personal items shall be free of writing, pictures, or any other insignia which are crude, vulgar, profane, or sexually suggestive; shall not bear drug, alcohol, or tobacco company advertising, promotions, or likenesses; shall not promote violence, illegal activity, or relate to gang affiliation or activity; and shall not advocate racial, religious, or sexual orientation prejudice.

19. Clothes shall be worn as intended and be sufficient to conceal undergarments, which shall be worn and covered at all times.
20. Pro logos on school materials of any kind are not acceptable (binders, folders, backpacks, pens, pencils, ~~etc.~~)

B. Grooming

1. Hair shall be clean and neatly groomed.
2. Hair or mustache styles which cause undue attention are not acceptable; e.g., unusual designs, colors, symbols, messages, mohawks, Faux-Hawks, or unusual razor cuts. Complete razor shaving of the head is allowed.
3. Beards are not allowed. Sideburns are allowed; but may not extend past the base of the earlobe or be wider than one inch (1").
4. Bangs or other hairstyles must not obstruct nor interfere with vision.
5. For those courses where long hair may pose a safety risk, such as where mechanical equipment with moving parts are used or where there is an open flame, long hair must be in a protective head covering, such as a hair net or cap, or hair must be securely bound behind the head, consistent with rules established by the instructor.
6. Tattoos, permanent or temporary, must be covered at all times.

C. Jewelry

~~4.~~ Piercing jewelry is acceptable in the ears only. Piercing jewelry that is intended to alter the natural shape of the ear is prohibited. Other body piercing jewelry (e.g., that for piercings in the eyebrows, nose, lips, ~~or~~ tongue) is not acceptable. Distracting jewelry, including piercing jewelry that draw undue attention, is not allowed.

D. Exemptions

1. Religious beliefs, bona fide medical reasons, or other good cause based on legal requirements, when verified, may be grounds for an exemption to a specific portion of ~~the Dress and Grooming Board Policy No. 5132.~~
2. A petition for an exemption from enforcement of a specified portion of ~~Dress-Code Board Policy No. 5132~~ (see Exhibit No. 5132(1) – Petition for Waiver of Dress and Grooming Compliance) may be submitted to the Student Services and School Attendance office. An appeal of a denial of any exemption shall be submitted in writing to the Associate Superintendent; of School Leadership; within 30 calendar days of the denial.

In the event that ~~an appeal~~^{it} does not ~~raise allegations within the District's uniform complaint procedures (UCP) in Board Policy No. 1312.3,~~ then, within 30 calendar days of receipt of the appeal, the Associate Superintendent ~~of School Leadership~~ or designee shall gather facts and make a written determination, which shall be provided to the complainant. E. School Uniform Policy

1. The decision to pursue a school uniform policy must be initiated by parents and approved by the school S.A.R.T. committee and the site principal.
2. A school uniform committee will develop a survey to be sent to all parents regarding their position on a school uniform policy by January 15 of the school year prior to the implementation of a school uniform policy. Prior to the distribution of the survey, the committee must sponsor at least one parent forum or meeting open to all parents for the purpose of information and input.
3. ~~In order~~^{For} a school site to further consider a school uniform, at least a majority of the surveys distributed must be returned and a majority of the surveys returned must support a uniform policy. These majorities are considered minimums and school sites have the discretion to establish more stringent standards of returns and support.
4. The ~~Governing~~ Board must be notified by February 1 of the school year prior to the implementation of a school uniform policy.
5. The school site shall notify all parents or guardians no less than six ~~(6)~~ months prior to the time the uniform policy is implemented.
6. Should a school adopt a uniform policy, resources shall be available to assist economically disadvantaged students; and a procedure for parents/guardians to opt out of the policy shall be in place.

DISCUSSION:

The Board hired and approved an Employment Agreement with the Superintendent effective July 1, 2017 for a period of four years. On November 18, 2020, the Board extended the Employment Agreement for a period of three years from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024 as set forth in the Extension to Employment Agreement (Extension). In the Extension, the Board agreed to review a survey of superintendent compensation from one or more independent source(s) and consider an adjustment to the Superintendent's compensation as it has remained the same since July 1, 2017.

The Board has received and reviewed a survey of superintendent compensation from an independent source as well as other available information. The survey is attached. Other information includes available superintendent employment contracts of the comparative school districts and publicly accessible data through Transparent California.

Based on the survey and other information, the Board will consider the approval of an amendment to the Superintendent's Employment Agreement (Amendment), as submitted. The Amendment is attached.

BACKGROUND

The Clovis Unified School District Board appointed Dr. Eimear O’Farrell as the District’s Superintendent in 2017, with an initial four-year employment contract covering the period June 14, 2017 through June 2021. Last November, the Board and Superintendent agreed upon a new three-year contract extension for the period July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2024. As part of this extension, the Board agreed to retain an outside firm to review Superintendent O’Farrell’s cash compensation, which has not changed since the first contract was signed.

Reward Strategy Group’s (RSG) cash compensation review is provided in the remainder of this report.

CURRENT COMPENSATION

Base salary:	\$230,000
Longevity pay:	\$18,975
Total annual cash:	<u>\$248,975</u>

While Dr. O’Farrell’s employment agreement was written noting *base salary* and *longevity bonus* components, the reality is the annual cash compensation value of the job was determined to be the sum of those components, \$248,975. Most school districts hiring a new Superintendent would have no need to address *salary plus longevity*. This report compares the Clovis USD Superintendent’s *annual cash value* to that same value in other districts we surveyed. Only one of the 15 surveyed districts also included longevity in their Superintendent contract (Corona-Norco USD), and this longevity amount has been added to the base salary in that data comparison.

THE COMPENSATION SURVEY COHORT

RSG reviewed Clovis USD’s organizational information and metrics. We developed a recommended list of 15 California school districts we concluded would be representative of the employment market in which CUSD competes for executive positions. We made the decision to mediate significant cost-of-living differences among regions by excluding districts in the Bay Area and LA/Orange/San Diego Counties. We provided this recommended survey cohort to the District for review and concurrence.

The 15 school districts from which we collected Superintendent cash compensation data are listed on the next page, and include student enrollment numbers.

RSG'S COMMENTS

We believe it is important for the Board/District to see and consider the current differences in Superintendent compensation for the full spectrum of districts in the survey cohort hierarchy.

Size differences among organizations — at their outer limits — do matter in terms of differences in the complexity and challenges (and the *intrinsic value*) of the Superintendent job. From RSG's perspective, Fresno Unified and Elk Grove Unified are a full standard deviation larger than Clovis USD. But on the other end of our cohort, Madera, Central and Sanger are at least two standard deviations smaller. *All* are influencing the competitive employment market for quality Superintendents.

This Amendment to Employment Agreement Between Clovis Unified School District and Eimear O'Farrell, Ed.D. ("Amendment") is entered into on July 21, 2021 subject to approval by the Governing Board .

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Governing Board ("Board") hired Eimear O'Farrell, Ed.D. ("Superintendent") on July 1, 2017 for a period of four years ("Employment Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Board extended the Superintendent's Employment Agreement for a period of three years from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2024 on November 18, 2020 as set forth in the Extension to Employment Agreement Between Clovis Unified School District and Eimear O'Farrell, Ed.D. ("Extension"); and

WHEREAS, the Board agreed in the Extension to review a survey of superintendent compensation from independent sources as the Superintendent's compensation has remained the same since July 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Board, having considered survey information, including information from other sources including publicly available sources, agrees to the following adjustments to total compensation and benefits.

1. Salary Adjustment. Effective July 1, 2021, the Superintendent's base salary shall be \$268,000. The base salary shall be reviewed annually by the Governing Board.
2. Life Insurance Reduction. The Superintendent's life insurance amount of \$1,000,000, provided at the expense of the District, shall be reduced to \$100,000.
3. No Other Modification. Except as set forth herein in the Amendment and the previously approved Extension, all other terms of the Employment Agreement shall remain the same without modification or amendment.

RECOMMENDATION:

Ratify a Memorandum of Understanding with the California Teaching Fellows Foundation (CTFF) effective August 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, in order to provide additional instructional assistants and direct support to all students who qualify for Clovis Unified's After School Education and Safety (ASES) Program.

DISCUSSION:

California Teaching Fellows Foundation (CTFF) employs undergraduates enrolled in a community college or university. CTFF reaches undergraduates in fields beyond teacher preparation to include kinesiology, science, engineering, business, art, music, drama, recreation and more. Teaching Fellows (TF) tutors reinforce their own learning by teaching in their chosen field, while K-12 students gain from engaging teaching methods. In Clovis Unified, CTFF staff the ASES Program at all 12 of Clovis Unified's Title I Elementary Schools where the program is offered as well as staffing several regular day school programs across the district.

The ASES Program is an extension of the regular school day in partnership with community agencies to provide afterschool education and enrichment. Student and parent surveys indicate that participation in the ASES Program helps increase and improve students' academic achievement, attendance, and a sense of school pride.

In addition, Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires local educational agencies (LEA) to determine schools that meet the criteria for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI). Once determined, LEA and CSI schools must partner with stakeholders to locally develop and implement a plan to improve student outcomes. Both Gateway and Clovis Community School Day (CCDS) will use CTFF to support and improve student outcomes as seen in Table 3.

Also, CTFF tutors/IAs will support Career Technical Education students in the classroom providing instruction in small groups, assisting students with CTE projects in the lab setting, and one-on-one if needed at the work-based learning sites.

Teaching Fellows are supervised by credential site certificated leads and receive ongoing professional development provided by school site, CTFF, and the district. Teaching Fellows bring energetic, trained staff members to help students after the regular school day and in turn receive hands-on experiences in preparation for a career in education. The use of CTFF participants was first approved by the CUSD Governing Board in March 2007.

Each school's ASES Program contract with CTFF is based on the number of TF staff and their projected work hours. Child Development holds a separate contract to provide ongoing

professional development on non-school days and/or weekends to promote ongoing learn and support to our Teaching Fellows staff. This ensures that our Teaching Fellows staff are equipped with tools and resources to work with our students in the program.

The attached table shows the distribution of resources by each school and/or department.

California Education Code section 42603 authorizes school districts to make inter-fund loans between funds. It is in the best interest of the District to allow such loans in order to facilitate the investing of money and to avoid having to borrow money from outside financial institutions when one of the funds may have a cash shortage. This inter-fund loan process is utilized only as authorized by the California Education Code, which requires that the loan be repaid in the same year, or subsequent year, if borrowing takes place within 120 days of the fiscal year-end. The Education Code also does not allow more than 75% of the money held in any fund during the current fiscal year to be transferred. District Administration recommends the Board approve a resolution authorizing these inter-fund loans during the fiscal year of 2021-22, as needed.
